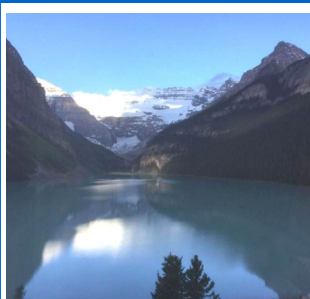

The kitchen had a giant furnace where servants would have roasted all of the banquet's meat. We were lucky enough to see the furnace in action with a fire lit underneath it. IMBERHORNE SCHOOL TANZANIAN EXCHANGE 2019/20

I'm Hannah Clark, a Crawley Down resident, and I'm lucky enough to be on the Imberhorne Tanzanian Exchange Programme for 2019/20. I play a big role in planning local events in support of the Imberhorne Tanzanian Link. I'm part of a group of 12 Imberhorne 6th Form students who are taking part in this exchange programme with 12 boys from Minaki High School in Southern Tanzania. On 17th October 2019 we will be travelling to Tanzania for two weeks where we will be planning lessons, teaching in primary schools and working in the Kisarawe orphanage.

Our Mission: Our first goal is to raise £10,000 by the end of September 2019 to welcome the 12 Minaki boys to the UK in February 2020, where they will experience English education, food, culture, and explore the cities of London and Brighton. Once this goal has been met, we then need to raise as much extra money as we can (our goal is another £10,000) to support the orphanage. For example, filling their water tank, ensuring they have enough food, supplying bunk beds, entertainment, educational resources, sanitary products and much more!

So Far: As soon as we were selected for the exchange in January 2019, we began raising money at any event we could organise! We regularly help at school parents' evenings selling refreshments and we frequently hold bake sales at local sporting events. We also held a very successful Race Night in March with over 100 people attending. One of our most successful events was an "Open Mic Night" held at Olivers Coffee & Wine bar in Copthorne during April. By June we had raised around £6,000, which may seem a lot, but we need so much more to make the impact we desire and change lives in our partner school and orphanage!

Our Wish: We recognise how lucky we are to have the lives that we do and we ask all of you to think about these underprivileged students in Tanzania that need our support.

An Interview with Michael Mancey : Crawley Down - Past, Present and Future

This article is part of a series that will be published by the Village Magazine over the next few editions giving insights from both long term residents of the Village, newcomers and other personalities as to their impressions of life here, now and in the past, along with their hopes for the future.

For the first in the series, we were delighted to have the chance to chat recently to a resident who will be recognised by many in the Village, to reveal his personal perspective on the Village as a place to live.



Michael Mancey moved to Hillside with his young family in 1979, not long after the construction of the Burleigh Woods development that substantially increased the size of the Village. This was when the Junior School was located next to the Church, and well before the building of the Haven Centre. Michael recalled that his home backed onto fields with donkeys in (hence the naming of The Donkey Field Pre-School). He now has three generations of his family living in the village.

In the early 1980s the facilities in the Village were totally inadequate to support the 4000 residents, just the relatively small Village Hall on Turners Hill Road. Little thought seems to have been given by the planners then to providing the essential infrastructure. Has anything changed today?

Michael became part of a team of volunteers, led by Dorothy Hatswell and assisted by Tony Clements, to raise funds to create a purpose built community centre: the CDCCA. WSCC built a new Junior School adjacent to the Infants School in Hophurst Drive and in 1987 the old school was converted into an interim Community Centre and Social Club with the proviso that once a purpose built was available, the property could be sold for development and the proceeds used to help fund the new centre.

This temporary Community Centre, which included the Social Club, was highly successful, had hundreds of members, and sufficient funds were accumulated to start planning the building of the Haven Centre at a cost of over £1m. MSDC and WPC (and others) made grants, and building work started. The Haven Centre was officially opened on 24th June 1991 by HRH Princess Alexandra.

Throughout its history, the Haven Centre has been run by volunteers as a village resource. Initially it was very successful, but times change and with dwindling resources the management increasingly became a challenge. MSDC came to the rescue in 2016 and paid off the outstanding mortgage. The Social Club could not generate enough income to keep trading and so closed in 2017. Fortunately, the CDCCA were able to quickly reopen it in a new format, the Haven Centre Bar and Coffee shop. Michael expressed his concern that, despite all these more recent developments, without more support and use by residents, this vital facility could still face a challenging future.

The Village faces similar challenges today; the school is being expanded but can hardly keep pace with the growing number of children. People talk about "someone" doing something to improve the infrastructure like roads, shops, pubs and medical facilities. Meanwhile they have to drive into Crawley or East Grinstead for entertainment on poorly maintained roads. Appointments at the Health Centre are often over a month in

the future. Like many others, Michael expressed extreme frustration at the apparent lack of consideration shown by MSDC with the continual, relentless approval for more housing development in Crawley Down.

The Crawley Down Residents Association (CDRA) has traditionally organised the Village Fayre in September and the Christmas lights switch-on in the village centre. Michael recently became involved with the CDRA, following an appeal at the beginning of 2019 for more villagers to join their committee. He also was delighted to add that there is a dedicated, hard-working core to their committee, the majority of whom are relative newcomers to the Village. He added, however, that they would still welcome additional members, young or old.

The Village is regarded by the majority of residents as a great place to live. The developers have no problem selling the houses they are building but we could do so much more with what we have.

The Haven Centre, including all the football and sports facilities, provides fantastic opportunities for fun and exercise; we have a thriving Cricket Club and a Tennis Club with four excellent courts. The Village Green and Children's Play Area provide a great green space at the heart of the Village. The small parade of shops does a great job with their limited space and, whilst we still battle to save The Royal Oak pub, we have a renowned Italian restaurant, an Indian takeaway and a Fish & Chip shop. The Glebe Centre, the Community Centre adjacent to All Saints' Church, plays host to a wide range of organisations including Girl Guiding groups, the Evening Women's' Institute, Pilates, the University of the Third Age (U3A), the village Youth Club and Tiny Tots. Throughout all this, we have always had the benefit of the ageing Village Hall. Sadly, with urgent renovations and repairs needed, this facility is now facing an uncertain future.

Michael voiced his concern as to whether future generations would include the person or groups that will energise those in the village to continue to make it a better, more inclusive and special place to live. He cited an increasing problem with anti-social behaviour by a small minority of younger residents. Improving facilities and installing CCTV might help to solve this. He was disappointed to note that Sussex Police seem to have ruled out devoting any dedicated resources to rural villages such as ours.

He had recently become aware that Worth Parish Council is working on a vision for the future. A council member told him that they have asked MSDC to devote more resources to planning the next phase in the development of the Village; not more houses, but better facilities, better access and better use of what we have got.

He also expressed the hope that the recently elected Mid Sussex District Council will now more strongly support the improvements to our village infrastructure that are required both for longer term residents and for the families who are now living here in the many new houses that have recently been built.

EVENING WI

On 6th June Janie Ramsay gave a talk on "The Jewels and Wardrobe of the Duchess of Windsor". Janie had worked for Sotheby's auction house in London for 25 years. She told us that the Duchess of Windsor (Wallis Simpson) had owned an amazing collection of jewellery which had been put up for auction in Geneva following her death in 1986. The collection consisted of 214 pieces and it sold for \$53.5 million. Janie had brought along the original catalogues from the auction listing the jewels on sale. Since the auction, many of the pieces have been resold for vast sums of money. The Duke and Duchess had a fascination with jewellery and both designed new pieces and remodelled those already in the collection. Janie gave us a snapshot into the life of the Duchess who was twice divorced before subsequently marrying King Edward VIII following his abdication in 1936. The Duchess also had a large collection of couture dresses, designer handbags and shoes. Janie gave us a "sparkling" presentation, summarising the personal life of a couple who had lived an extremely lavish lifestyle.

On 4th July, Lesley Boardman presented "The Island of Forty Thieves - Bermuda". The island is a British Territory in the North Atlantic under UK Law. It has a population of about 71,000 and has a sub-tropical climate. It also lies in the hurricane belt. The beautiful scenery and pink-sand beaches attract many tourists to its collection of small islands. Our history with the island dates from 1609 when an English ship foundered on a coral reef and whose sailors and passengers subsequently settled in Bermuda. From her personal knowledge of the island whilst living there, Lesley told us that rain water falling off the white roofs of houses is collected in vast water tanks and how absolutely everything has to be imported and shipped to the island. Bermuda's main source of income is from offshore insurance, reinsurance and tourism. Large cruise ships dock in the capital city Hamilton, where American tourists flock to the seafront shops to purchase expensive British goods.

We meet at 7.30pm on the 1st Thursday of the month in the Glebe Centre and visitors will be made very welcome.

Chairman's Report

The Parish Council had an uncontested election in May as there were exactly the same number of candidates as seats. I was honoured to be re-elected as Chairman of the Council at the Annual Meeting in May and pleased to have Phillip Coote again as my Vice Chairman.

We said goodbye to three of our councillors – John Allen, Paul Blakemore and Lindsey Field; their contribution will be missed. However, we welcomed three new faces – Paul Budgen, Jim Curzon and Les Flanagan.

We now have a new term of office for four years, so the Council has decided to review its community strategy to guide its decision making over this period. We have called this our Vision Plan and our Clerk is currently drafting this document for approval by the Council. The Council has been building up monies to fund these projects, which includes the installation of CCTV for both villages, increasing the provision of sporting facilities and the creation of a Community Land Trust to provide housing to meet local identified need.

On the subject of housing, we continue to try to ensure that any new development in the village is compliant with the policies in

the Crawley Down Neighbourhood Plan. To ensure that this is up to date, we are currently reviewing the Plan to ensure that the policies are fit for the purpose.

Reacting to the recent spate of theft and vandalism on the allotment site, we have improved the security by increasing the height of the gates and installing locks. We appreciate this is not popular with all residents, but as landlord we do have a duty of care towards the allotment tenants. We will be looking at putting in CCTV cameras on the site too, as part of our village project.

We had a stall at the recent Copthorne Carnival and intend to be at the Crawley Down Village Fayre in September – please come and see us there. However, if you have any issue that you would like the Council to address, please contact one of the Councillors below, or our Clerk. WSCC Highways Budget Cuts

WSCC Highways have told us that their budget has been cut from £14million to £7million. This will obviously lead to a cut in services.

The most affected will be the winter management, with only 28% of the network being cleared of snow, a decrease from the previous 48%. Only essential line painting work is being carried out on major roads; this includes "give way" markings

at junctions.

Grass cutting is being reduced from seven cuts a season five. We have already had residents complain to us about the height of the grass in the verges, particularly at roundabouts. However, this is not seen by WSCC to be a safety issue. Contact one of your County Councillors for more information – details can be found below.

The Royal Oak Pub

The current Asset of Community Value (ACV) listing for the pub expires in September 2019. At the request of the Save the Royal Oak Pub Team, Worth Parish Council applied for re-registration and the Council has just been notified that this has

been successful, with a new expiry date of September 2024. The owner has eight weeks to appeal this decision and has recently lodged an application to develop the Pub site with MSDC.

Annual Governance & Accountability Return 2018/19

The Council's Annual Return was approved at Full Council in June. This, and the supporting accounting information, are now available for public inspection between 1st July and 9th August.

Love West Sussex

Whilst the Parish Council office is happy to receive any reports of highways issues, all we can do is to pass these on to WSCC. It may be quicker for you to report direct!

By going to love.westsussex.gov.uk, you can report potholes, damage to inspection covers, overhanging vegetation and much

more. You don't have to have an account to report issues, and there is also an option to load photos of the problem.

Although this site was a bit clumsy in the past, it has been updated, and more reactive – why not give it a try!

Environmental Working Parties

Our work is to improve the quality of life for our residents and that does not necessarily mean major projects. Sometimes a new litter bin, or a patch of grass being mown, or a trough of planting can make a big difference. To address this, the Council

is setting up two Environmental Working Parties - one for each village - to see what we can do to make our villages look more attractive. If you are interested in becoming involved, then please contact the Clerk.

At its June meeting, the Council agreed to change its pattern of meeting dates. Still taking place on Mondays, these will be every other week from September rather than the current schedule of three a month. See our website for further details. 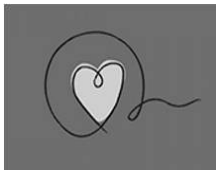
