The Great Crawley Down Easter Egg Hunt Good Friday, 30th March 2018

The first event organised by CDRA each year is now becoming tradition - the Great Easter Egg Hunt on Good Friday.

In keeping with last year, the day began with various Easter Bunnies being released from the warren outside the shops with the Bunny controllers handing out bags of eggs to each Bunny to give to the children as they worked their way around the village. Each Bunny also had 3 silver eggs in their bags - the lucky child who picked one out won a bigger egg.

The Bunnies were then dismissed to their various posts around the village to await marauding children (and parents) to find work out where they were and pick an egg from the bag. To locate the Bunnies each child had to follow a trail set by completing clues to get from Bunny to Bunny.



Naturally within minutes of starting the rain set in but Crawley Down Bunnies are made of hard stuff - as are Crawley Down children - so this had no impact. We know that the queue to register for the hunt stretched from the shops to well past the allotments for some time! As the morning progressed it was clear that this was a bumper (or thumper) year with soaked children and parents finding soaked Bunnies to gain more eggs. By around 1pm all Bunnies were called back to the warren by Bunny control with no eggs left. The event was again very successful with around 270 children taking part and over 2,500 little eggs were given out by the Bunnies.

The generosity of Crawley Down people was also clear since Bunnies were supplied with tea by residents at their locations, despite the awful weather. Thank you to McColl's and the Co-Op who donated Easter eggs.

A huge thank you to the children, their parents, the Bunnies, the team at the shops, the CDRA Committee and sponsors, and The Co-Op and McColl's for making this such a great event.

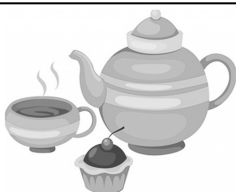

On 5th April, we welcomed Hilary Stirling as our guest speaker. Hilary is a special education teacher and her subject was "Josiah Wedgwood - Master Potter". Josiah Wedgwood 1730-1795 was a well-respected Master Potter, entrepreneur and abolitionist. He was a pioneer of the mass production of pottery and as a result of this innovation, costs could be reduced. This enabled his pottery to be sold extensively all over Britain as well as in Europe and America. Every new invention that Wedgwood produced were soon copied. He opened showrooms in London which were very successful as they gave the public the opportunity to view his complete range of tableware. He was a humanitarian who improved conditions for staff working in his factories and looked after their general welfare. Thanks were extended to Hilary for an interesting and enjoyable presentation.

The first part of our meeting on 3rd May was a discussion of the Resolution which will be presented at the NFWI Annual Meeting in Cardiff on 6th June. Jenny Allt, a WI Adviser, lead the discussion and then a vote was taken. Following a break for tea and cakes, our guest speaker, Holly Trezise, was introduced. Holly is a member of the small fundraising team at the Rocking Horse Charity based in Brighton. It was set up in 1967 by Dr Trevor Mann with the aim of improving the lives of sick children by providing life-saving and cutting edge equipment. Many children & babies are supported by the charity. Fundraising events are arranged throughout the year and are organised in schools, places of work and in the community. We learnt so much about this worthwhile children's charity from Holly's informative presentation.

In June our speaker will be Pat Bryer whose presentation is entitled "Choice Joyce (A flavour of Joyce Grenfell)". Visitors are most welcome to come along to what should be a fun evening.

CRAWLEY DOWN VILLAGE C OF E SCHOOL

During this term Years 3 & 4 have been learning about their local history

On Friday 20th April, Years 3 & 4 took part in an exciting history treasure hunt. As part of their "Home is where the heart is" topic, the children have to become familiar with their local history and the major changes the village has seen. We were fortunate enough to have beautiful weather and the full support of the church and some knowledgeable volunteers who enriched our treasure hunt along the way!



Strolling through the sunshine, the carefully planned route took us past the old war memorial, church, down onto Worth way and back into the village to see evidence of the station and brickworks. We then even found time to re-enact the first planting of the coronation oak tree as the children sang "Land of Hope and Glory" in a circle around

the Jubilee tree! Next we looked at the blue memorial plaques along Bowers Place to appreciate the sacrifice of villagers during the first and second world war.

The children were thrilled to discover an interesting display and volunteers specially assembled for them in the church. We learnt about some former pupils of the old school, their uniform and even handwriting competitions – some things never change!



As well as historical facts about the village, the pupils are learning in school about the Anglo-Saxon kingdom of Sussex and are trying to persuade more people to visit Crawley Down by creating a page for a brochure! We really appreciated the help provided by Vicar Christine, Vicar Jill and their kind volunteers who helped us appreciate the village's history.

"I learnt that the Worth Way used to be a railway line, and that there is a jubilee tree planted in our village park." Chloe "We were excited to find out that the old school building is still next to the church which was built in 1843. The old school has since been converted into homes," Natasha, Emily and Eloise.

"I was shocked to find out that there was a lot of damage from falling trees in the 1987 storm," Harry.

"I found out that the 2002 Jubilee Tree is an important way of celebrating the Queen's anniversaries," Bea.

"I was surprised to find out that we used to have a train station where the shops are now," Lewis.

"My favourite part of the walk was down the Worth Way as I could see the clay used for bricks and that the steep banks were dug out by hand," Elsie.

"I enjoyed finding out about the War Memorial and reading the carving around its base," Megan.

"Finding out that illegal boxing used to happen in The Prize Fighter pub (now called the Royal Oak) was a real surprise to me!" Taylor.

Spring was late this year and it has been difficult to get started due to the inclement weather. Consequently, we still have available a limited supply of seeds etc - see below. It is still not too late to plant as nature seems to have a way of "catching up". So don't despair if you are behind, all is not lost, and remember home grown produce tastes so much better than shop bought vegetables!

The Allotment Hut is open on Saturdays & Sundays from 10am until Noon

Potatoes - 1kg Bag £1.50; 2kg Bag £3; 3kg Bag £4.50

Onion Sets & Shallots - £3.50 for 500g; £2.00 for 250g

Also available are carrots, onions, leeks, peas (early & late), runner, broad and French beans, tomatoes, cucumbers etc.

Garden accessories are also available eg. gardening gloves, watering cans, garden twine, canes (3 ft, 4 ft, 6 ft and 8 ft), netting, plus a range of pesticides and insecticides. Also stocked are fertiliser, lawn sand, sulphate of potash, lime etc.

NEWSLETTER - SUMMER 2018



WORTH PARISH ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

This took Place in April this year. The Council invite all groups who have been in receipt of a grant in the previous year to attend and to give a brief talk on the grant.

Surrey & Sussex Air Ambulance - £500

A representative from the Air Ambulance thanked the Council for the grant. It is a charity with little funding from central government as it is not part of the NHS but works closed with the NHS Ambulance Service. It costs £6.5 million to keep the ambulance in the air, and it helps 4 million people across Sussex, Surrey and Kent. The operational base is at Redhill aerodrome but is shortly to move to Rochester due to housing development proposals at Redhill.

There are currently two helicopters which, are limited in size and fuel capacity. A new machine has just been leased, which is much larger. This means that paramedics can work on a patient in the cabin rather than on the ground. The new helicopter is in the process of being adapted to be an ambulance; it takes around a year to become operational.

The Council asked that its grant be used for blood storage equipment. The blood must be stored at between 2 and 6 degrees, and then must be heated before giving to a patient hence the specialist equipment. 150 people required blood last year, so the Council's grant was very gratefully received.

St John's Sunshine Pre-School - £200

Kimberley Brimelow from the Pre-School thanked the Council for the grant of £200. The garden area was muddy meaning the children could not use it so the money was used to put bark down to improve the area.

Copthorne Village Hall - £500 plus £2,875 from Worth United Charities

The current project is to remove and replace the stage area. This was built in 1927 and asbestos was found. The Council's grant of £500 is going towards the asbestos removal.

The Committee were delighted to receive the £2875 from the dissolution of Worth United

Charities, which will go towards a new stage. This project will cost in the region of £30,000; the old stage is being removed in August.

St John the Evangelist Church - £412

Sue Williams, Church Warden, thanked the Council for the grant which was used towards the cost of tree surgery in the church yard.

All Saints' Church - £250

Kerry Scott Church Treasurer, showed slides of tree works which took place in the churchyard. A huge branch fell down over the Christmas period, causing damage. Whilst there is insurance, the Church was liable.

The Council gives an annual grant of £500 to each of the churchyards; All Saints' and to St John's; as anyone in the village has a right to be buried in the churchyard, so it is a community asset. However, safety is a prime concern, as graves sink, and the trees need maintaining.

The Haven Centre - £2,875 from Worth United Charities

The Centre opened in 1990 as a Social Club. The Club closed in March 2017 but the Centre re-opened within two weeks. There is currently no pub in Crawley Down and residents felt strongly that there should be a bar in the village.

They were also keen to have a café, so one was opened in July last year to give locals the opportunity to meet up for coffee and cake. Initially it was open for 3 days a week, but that soon went up to 5 days a week

Planning Applications - What Can't I Complain About?

There are various issues which are not legally relevant to the consideration of a Planning Application and will carry no weight should you decide to comment - these are called NON-MATERIAL PLANNING CONSIDERATIONS and include:

- Matters controlled under building regulations or other non-planning legislation eg. structural stability, drainage details, fire precautions, matters covered by licences etc.
- Private issues between neighbours eg. land/boundary disputes, damage to property, private rights of access, covenants, ancient and other rights to light etc.
- Problems arising from the construction period of any works eg. noise, dust, construction vehicles, hours of working (covered by Control of Pollution Acts).
- Opposition to the principle of development when this has been settled by an outline planning permission or appeal
- Applicant's personal circumstances (unless exceptionally and clearly relevant eg. provision of facilities for someone with a physical disability)
- Previously made objections/representations regarding another site or application
- Factual misrepresentation of the proposal
- Opposition to business competition
- Loss of property value
- Loss of view

Small Business Grants

Mid Sussex District Council is offering local micro businesses grant funding of up to £2,000 to help them grow and expand.

The grants are available to any Mid Sussex business that has less than 10 employees and an idea for a project that will help their business grow. Up to £1,500 is also available to help micro businesses take on an apprentice.

This is the second year that Mid Sussex District Council has offered grant funding to help support the local economy and encourage sustainable business growth.

Mid Sussex is one of the strongest local economies in the country and is keen to support businesses and economic growth. The planned growth of Mid Sussex over the coming years will create thousands of jobs, see new business parks being built and bring investment in infrastructure. They want local small businesses to be able to benefit from these opportunities, grow and thrive. Last year, micro-business grants helped more than 40 local companies to expand and develop their business in Mid Sussex.

For example we inform residents about transport coffee mornings, lunch clubs, computer classes, telephone befriending, dementia and Alzheimer's services.
