A LIBRARY FOR EVERY OCCASION

"...the Spirit will guide you into all truth" (John 16:13)

At her coronation, the Queen was given a Bible with the words *"the most precious thing this world affords"*. The Bible is the world's best-selling book of all time. However, it isn't one book, but a library of 66 books, composed by some 44 writers over a period of 1,500 years in a range of literature including history, poetry, prophecy, letters and apocalyptic (end times). This is the basis of the unity of its message and authoritative claim to be the primary way by which God speaks to us. The Bible equips us to live for God in every aspect of our lives. We also have the promise of the Holy Spirit to guide us in applying the words to our lives.

When hearing the Scriptures or as we read them as part of our own prayers and reflections, God reaches out to us and comforts us, renews our hope, walks beside us in anxious and challenging times, and calls us to pilgrimage and faith. It is more than the words that we read on the page. The Bible is a vehicle or channel for the word of God. This word is a gift of God the Holy Spirit. Through this very diverse collection, from many different people and times we are called into an encounter, involved in a story, brought into companionship with those who worked out their relationship to God: in teaching, in formulating laws and stories, in chronicling the history of their people, in praise and celebration and thanksgiving, in reflecting upon life in God's world, in facing adversity and struggle with faith and hope and trust in God and his promises.

As we approach Lent during this very challenging time in our nation and world, may we look to God to guide us as we hold onto his promises in hope as revealed to us in the words of Scripture. As we seek to walk with him day by day in this difficult time, we can know he is with us in all things.

CRAWLEY DOWN EVENING WI

Our first Zoom Christmas Party was held on 2nd December when members entered into the spirit of the occasion by wearing home-made festive hats, some of which were decorated with flashing fairy lights. Our guest speaker, Andy Thomas, was then invited to join us and his presentation was entitled: “Christmas – a festive history”. Andy said that we had celebrated the birth of Jesus Christ for many centuries and it could be traced back to Roman times. In many countries, people attend places of worship on 25th December when carols were sung.

Over time, traditions such as the decorating of homes with holly and ivy and the eating of poultry and game, became the norm. However, in the mid 1640's Christmas had been banned by the Puritans, but fortunately, it was revived in 1660 by Charles I. Many of the family traditions we follow today, such as decorating Christmas trees, filling stockings with sweets and the giving of presents, were brought into the mainstream by Queen Victoria's husband, Prince Albert. We certainly learnt a great deal from Andy!

All too soon Christmas was over and we started our WI year on 7th January with Gilly Halcrow talking to us about the “History of Food, Drink and Table Manners”. Gilly told us that she had worked in National Trust houses so had seen the very lavish dining rooms that the aristocracy had used for entertaining their guests. During these banquets, guests ate an excessive amount of food and consumed large quantities of alcohol.

However, life could not have been more different for the poorer working classes who were eating very simple meals such as pottage which consisted of vegetables, and meat or fish if they were lucky. Table manners improved from the late 1600's onwards when knives and forks were more widely used. Thanks were extended to Gilly for her interesting presentation.

WORTH ABBEY NEWS

FEBRUARY - MARCH 2021

Worth Abbey is open for Mass and private prayer in line with government guidelines.

There will be three Masses during the week - Saturday at 5pm, The Vigil Mass for Sunday at 9.30am and Tuesday at 10am.

You are welcome to participate remembering that maintaining social distancing does limit the space available. Track and Trace is operating, or you can register using a form when you arrive at the church. **Please wear a face covering and use the hand sanitiser provided.**

Should you wish to stream the Parish Mass at 5pm on Saturday, the code is <https://vimeo.com/event/597192>. Your presence at this mass will be assumed to signify your agreement with streaming. If you do not wish to be visible, please avoid the two front benches around the church.

The church will be open for private prayer at 2pm on Thursday when there will also be the opportunity for confession. The entrance for private prayer will be via the East Door (on the lower level) not from the Narthex. Confession is also available on Sunday morning at 9am (prior to Mass) in the Unity Room.

Do please **remember the Quiet Garden here at Worth** which is a lovely spot for prayer and reflection (follow the signs from the main car park).

This year, Lent begins on Wednesday 17th February (Ash Wednesday), running until 4th April (Easter Sunday). Ash Wednesday masses will be at 10am (instead of Tuesday) and also at 7.30 pm. The Diocese is proposing an on-line mission for us all. For further details please see In Touch and the Diocesan website.

ALL IN THE MONTH OF

February

It was:

200 years ago, on 23rd Feb 1821 that John Keats, the poet, died of tuberculosis, aged 25.

125 years ago, on 1st Feb 1896 that the premiere of Giacomo Puccini's opera *La bohème*, took place in Turin, Italy.

75 years ago, on 11th Feb 1946 that The Revised Standard Version of the New Testament was published. It was the first major English-language update of the Bible since the King James version published in 1611.

70 years ago, on 27th Feb 1951 that the 22nd Amendment to the US Constitution was ratified. It limits the President to two terms in office.

65 years ago, on 11th Feb 1956 that two members of the Cambridge spy ring, British diplomats Guy Burgess and Donald Maclean, announced that they had defected to the Soviet Union. They had both vanished in mysterious circumstances in 1951.

50 years ago, on 15th Feb 1971 that the UK's currency was decimalised.

40 years ago, on 24th Feb 1981 that Buckingham Palace announced the engagement of Prince Charles and Lady Diana Spencer.

30 years ago, on 28th Feb 1991 that the Gulf War ended at midnight when a ceasefire came into effect.

25 years ago, on 15th Feb 1996 that the oil tanker Sea Empress ran aground near Milford Haven, Wales, causing a major oil spill along the coastlines of Wales and Ireland.

20 years ago, on 19th Feb 2001 that the first case of foot-and-mouth disease in the 2001 UK outbreak was detected at an abattoir in Essex. The EU subsequently banned all British meat, milk and livestock exports.

10 years ago, on 22nd Feb 2011 that the Canterbury earthquake in New Zealand took place. 185 people were killed and up to 2,000 injured, and there was widespread damage across the city.
