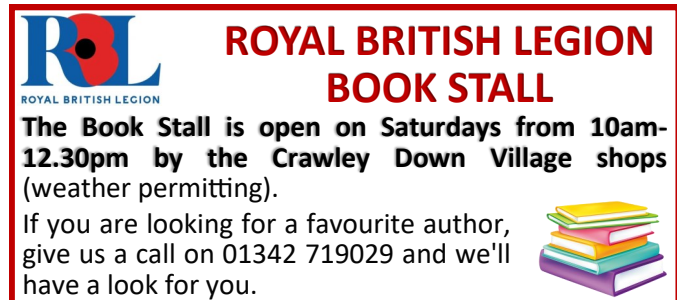

The choir were delighted to have been able to hold their Summer Concert this year on 13th June at the Haven Centre. The last summer concert was in 2019!



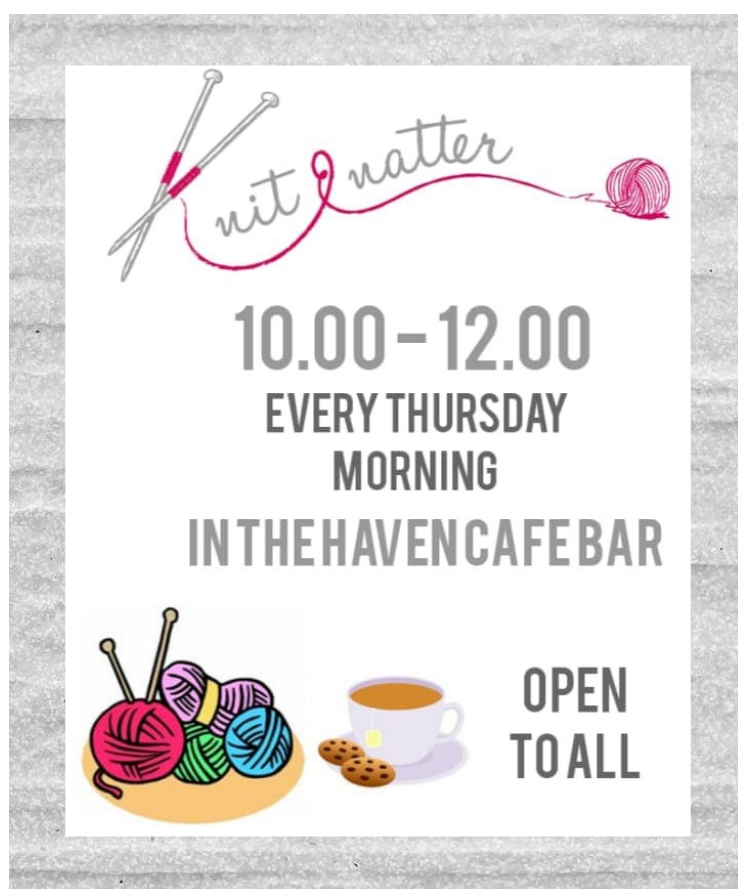
Accompanied by Sylvia Trench, the choir sang a very varied programme including some songs learnt during Zoom sessions during lockdown.

What a wonderful world!

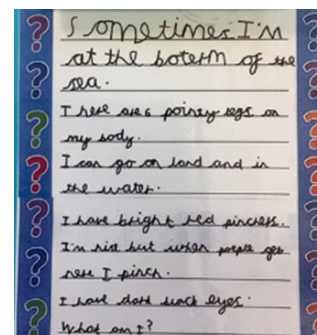
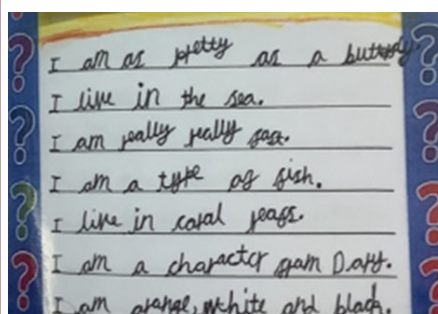
Year 2 have dived deep into the ocean this term and have been looking at how to look after the beautiful world we live in. We began our topic by exploring all the incredible sea animals and a few of our favourites were sharks, jellyfish, turtles, crabs and starfish.

We have looked at how animals are in danger due to the amount of rubbish that is ending up in the ocean – this shocked us! We decided to look into what **WE** could do to help. Our ideas included, putting litter in bins, correctly recycling materials, using compost bins, buying items that are biodegradable (not plastic) and passing toys and clothing on to others, rather than throwing them away.



We wanted to share our incredible knowledge of sea creatures so we all created riddles which have been published in a class book.

Here are some photos of our riddles, can you guess which underwater animal we are describing?



We have also been learning about the life cycle of plants. In Science, we grew cress in two different areas to see if a seed can germinate without light.

We were really interested to see each stage of the germination, so we have now placed beans in a plastic bag with a wet paper towel inside. This has allowed us to see the first stage of a plant's life cycle. We are really excited to continue to watch these grow. Some have already germinated!



Another project we have loved doing was using clay to create our own sea shells!



Finally, the school want to say a very big well done to the Year 2 children for completing their SATs in May.

They all tried incredibly hard and did their absolute best. We couldn't be prouder of them!

When it comes to local Repair Cafés you are spoilt for choice, but the Crawley Down and Turners Hill Repair Café is still the best (and proud to have been the first in Mid Sussex)! Since the first monthly meeting at the Haven Centre in September 2019 we've looked at 141 items, repaired 82 (58%), collected over £550 in donations for local charities and good causes, and hosted one visit by our local MP.

We meet on the 4th Saturday of the month and hold meetings alternately in two villages.

Sadly we lost our slot at the Haven Centre due to the pandemic, but we have found a new home at The Glebe Centre to complement The Ark in Turners Hill.

We will start a new season of regular meetings in September. We are always pleased to welcome new members to our small but dedicated team of volunteers. There is something very satisfying about a successful repair - it's good for the owner, it's good for the volunteer and it's good for the planet! Last year West Sussex collected 2,670 tons of waste electrical items, so there is plenty to keep us busy.

THE SAHARA, SUSSEX AND THE CAMELS!



Three years ago, we signed up to walk across the Sahara Desert to raise money for St Catherine's Hospice in Crawley. A crazy idea said friends and family who were concerned about our sanity and safety but, undeterred, we pressed on with our plans. We trained, fundraised and were all ready to go in March 2020 when Covid stopped us in our tracks. For the next 2 years it felt like it was never going to happen. Lockdown was incredibly hard on charities and this made us even more determined to help St Catherine's with the build of their new premises. The people who work there are special and go that extra mile for everyone they help and this inspired us every step of the way.

We had a long wait for Morocco to open its borders but, in April 2022, we were finally on our way to Gatwick airport with our walking poles, hiking boots, sleeping bags, head torches, gaiters, camel packs, high energy drinks, sun cream and plasters and a great deal more, ready to start our long awaited Sahara challenge.

Before we could start our desert trek, we had a 9-hour drive from Marrakesh through the magnificent High and Low Atlas Mountains to the town of Ouarzazate and from there onto the desert which, on arrival, felt like we had entered another world. Here we were met by our Berber guides and their camels. Over the four days we were in the desert we walked varying distances starting in the morning and stopping for around three hours to rest and have lunch and to wait until it was cooler so we could continue our journey. We had met some of the group beforehand and we quickly bonded, each person with their own personal reason for doing the walk and working as a team to overcome our individual challenges and all becoming increasingly aware of how lucky we were to be with such an interesting group of people.

We slept in two-man tents and lived without the bare essentials, quickly learning how to wash with wet wipes, to pack/unpack our holdalls in minutes and navigate our way to the make shift toilet tents at night with our headtorches. We walked through the most varied terrain over dried up river beds, up and down sand dunes, through sand storms and through desert villages. We learnt much about the simple and slower Berber way of life and how to make and cook the most delicious fresh bread under hot coals in the sand! Our experienced Berber guides and their herd of camels led the way, guided by their incredible knowledge of the desert which was quite a feat given the ever-changing landscape with no maps or satnav! It was Ramadan when we were in Morocco and whilst as a group we were well equipped, our guides walked through the desert in trainers and sandals, without drinking or eating between dawn and dusk and not once did they moan or lower their astonishingly high standard of care of us. They quickly became our friends. We were humbled by them, the compassion and empathy they showed for our cause, supporting and keeping us safe so that we could complete our challenge. It was an amazing and satisfying feeling to have completed the challenge and without one single blister! The support and comradery of our fellow walkers kept our spirits high when the temperatures soared and when we felt like we couldn't climb another sand dune or walk another step.

We collectively raised £5,808 and St Catherine's Hospice has now reached £137,922 of their £140,000 target.

At first, shoes were made exactly the same for both right and left feet. In the reign of Queen Elizabeth I, ankle straps and small heels were introduced. In the reign of Charles I, fancy shoes and boots with metal buckles were fashionable. An important innovation was the introduction of a buckle to actually fasten a shoe. In the 18th Century, women's shoes reflected the elaborate patterns of their dresses, but men's shoes were rather plain and manufactured out of black leather. In more modern times, shoe shops opened and many of us will remember the introduction of winkle pickers, stiletto heels, kitten heels and platform soles. Janet was a very engaging speaker who easily held our attention throughout her talk.

Thanks were extended to Ann Horrell and her family for hosting a cream tea at their beautiful home in June, and for preparing the delicious food. It really was lovely to see all the members dressed in their "posh" frocks.

On 7th July, Hilary Sterling was our speaker. Her subject was *"The Crafty Potter – influences and inspiration"*. NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Would you be interested in either helping to establish or join a new Neighbourhood Watch Scheme in your area?

The community spirit that we see in your area is very strong and we feel that this could further be strengthened with the setting up of a Neighbourhood Watch Scheme.

The benefits of such a scheme:

- Crime prevention advice.
- Greater awareness of current issues in your area.
- Support from area co-ordinators and a well-established and pro-active board.
- You would be supporting the Police in keeping your area a safe place to live and work.

There are two ways in which a scheme can be established:

1. The most common way is to have a set up meeting with all interested parties in a road/area. After this meeting a Neighbourhood Watch sign could then be ordered (there is a small fee involved). This then makes the scheme visible,

and members have the option to display a sticker in their windows.

2. An alternative way is what's called a "covert" scheme. This is an option where there is a positive response from a road/area but potential members are not keen to have the scheme or their membership known and no signage is displayed in the road/area.

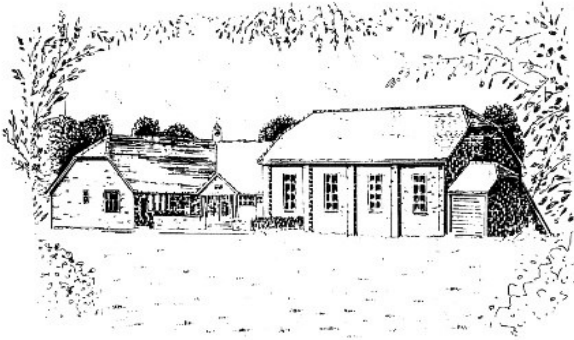

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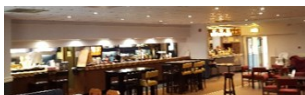
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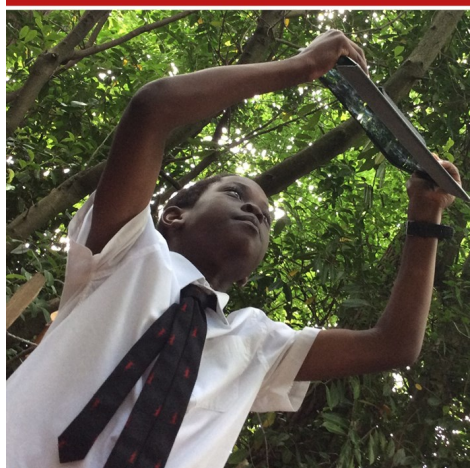
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
