WORTH PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

Councillor Tony Dorey was voted in to continue as Council Chairman for another year, at the Annual Meeting in May. Tony said *"I'm honoured to be given this opportunity, and to continue to serve the community. I would like to thank Councillor Kerry Scott for his support over the last three years as Assistant Chairman, and to welcome Councillor Phillip Coote who has now taken over this role."*

Worth Parish Council would like to send best wishes to everyone involved in the **GIG ON THE GREEN IN CRAWLEY DOWN ON 27TH JULY**.

The Council is pleased to have given support to this excellent community event, as well as to other village events during the year.

BOWERS PLACE PARKING

After some delay, the Arborist has now been on site to carry out their tree surveys and prepare the reports required to obtain planning permission for the **BOWERS PLACE PARKING SOLUTION**.

We anticipate being able to apply for planning permission as soon as that is received and then to go back out to tender to

identify a Preferred Supplier to undertake the work once planning permission is granted. Despite the delays, we remain optimistic that work can be completed this year and we will continue to update you as things progress.

CRAWLEY DOWN PLAYGROUND

The recent site visit with a Play and Sports Consultant at **CRAWLEY DOWN PLAYGROUND** gave us a lot of food for thought about how best to take this project forward.

Further discussions are now taking place to determine the best next steps before we agree the budget and timescale for the work and go out to tender to procure playground designs.

NOTICE BOARDS

Worth Parish Council approved the costs for the new **NOTICEBOARDS IN CRAWLEY DOWN** and for the grounds work required to remove the existing old noticeboards, make good the area and install them.

We have now placed the order for the new noticeboards to be

made and are currently waiting to hear when they will be ready to be delivered.

We will publish more on this when we know dates for installation as it is anticipated that ground works will take a few days requiring the area to be cordoned off.

CCTV PROJECT

We have experienced some delays in moving the **CCTV PROJECT** forward, due to the Preferred Supplier's commitment to update existing technologies in the Sussex Police area. We understand that work is due to finish shortly and we will be liaising with the Preferred Supplier to answer any final questions and resolve any remaining connectivity and wayleaves issues (the agreement required between the landowners and those who will access the land to do the work to install, service, maintain, repair, and replace the CCTV equipment).

After a review of the CCTV Project, the Council agreed that the first phase of the project will include 2 CCTV cameras, rather than the 4 originally anticipated. One will be placed on Copthorne Village Green. The other will be on the corner of Burleigh Way in Crawley Down. This will enable us to install those that are the simplest to install as they are not impacted by other projects, such as the Copthorne Recreation Ground project. Once installed we will allow a 6-month period to review how things are going before deciding whether to install more.

GRAFFITI

The Parish Council is aware of recent **GRAFFITI INCIDENTS** in both Crawley Down and Copthorne. We are monitoring these and liaising with the local police. If you see any more instances, **PLEASE CONTACT THE POLICE ON 101**.

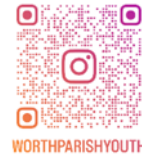

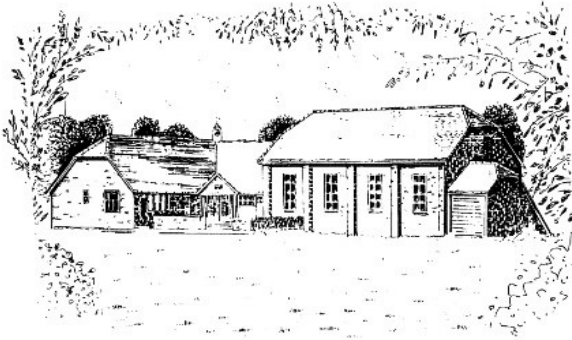

ROADS IN THE VILLAGE

The Parish Council has applied for two Community Highways Schemes. Thank you to everyone who completed the survey which we hope will strengthen the applications. The applications are as follows:

1. To improve a walking route to school for children who need to cross Lion Lane. A raised pillow will be requested which will cover the width of the road on Lion Lane from as you come out of the Twitten. This will have associated signage warning of children crossing.
2. Vehicle activated signs on all four roads that lead into the crossroads. These will flash up a speed along with a smiling/frowning face, OR a message to say, "slow down/thank you". Locations to be confirmed.

With the support of WSCC Cllr Bruce Forbes, the Parish Council has also applied to have an additional crossing patrol on Church Road. This is being assessed by West Sussex County Council.

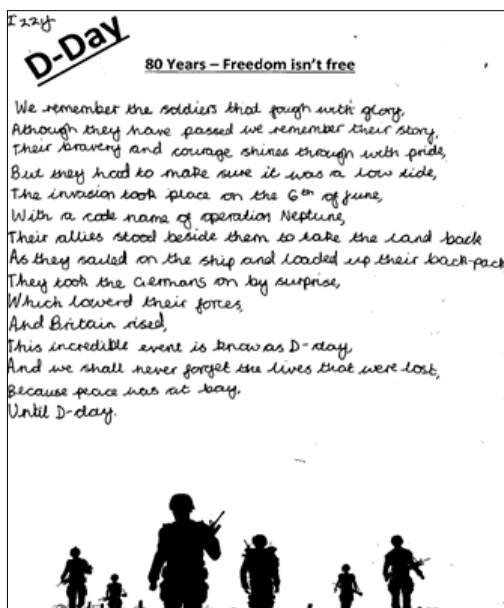

The children in Willow class helped raise the flag on the Green to mark 80 years since D-Day.

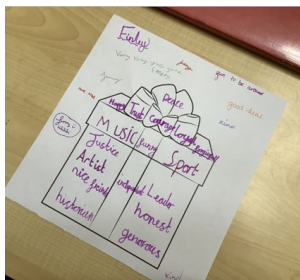


THEOLOGICALLY-BASED CHRISTIAN VISION DAY

Our RE day was spent exploring our School's Vision which is inspired by the following bible verse:

"As each has received a gift, use it to serve, as good stewards of God's love" - 1 Peter 4:10

The day was introduced by Rev Sandra in a Collective Worship exploring the gifts we receive from God and how we can be stewards of God's love using these gifts. The children explored these ideas further in class. KS1 explored the gifts we have on our planet and KS2 explored the gifts we have in ourselves. From these discussions, the children designed and made symbols to represent the gifts – which are going to be used to create a display in the entrance hall.

CRAWLEY DOWN VILLAGE C of E SCHOOL



Year 6 have been very busy during the Summer Term.

The children were wonderful in May, working incredibly hard to complete their SATs papers, we were all so proud of their efforts and maturity each day.

During the afternoons of SATs week, the children were able to get creative as they worked on producing some amazing animal collage art. This required the children to use a range of techniques, such as: monochrome pattern-making, watercolour and oil pastels. Each creation was inspired by an animal that could be found in the Amazon rainforests of South America.



BIKEABILITY



It was fantastic to see so many of our Year 6s participating in their Bikeability training. This opportunity was delivered by the wonderful team of instructors from West Sussex.

The aim of the training is to prepare the children as they transition to secondary school, to which many will decide to ride their bikes.

Level 1 training was initially completed on the school playground in big groups on day one. Once it was established that all the children were safe and competent cyclists, they were then taken out onto the roads of the village and were asked to perform a series of manoeuvres and skills.

All the children were able to successfully complete their Bikeability training and were awarded their certificates and badges. You may now see a lot of young cyclists out and about around the village.

DESIGN TECHNOLOGY BRIDGE PROJECTS

This term, the children took on the challenge of designing, making and evaluating a bridge. Each of their structures had to be strong enough to carry a weight to cross the river.

There were many steps in the process of building their bridges. Initially, the children had to learn about the different types of bridges: beam, arch, suspension and cable-stayed.



Then, in groups, they had to design and build their bridge using only lolly-sticks, tape, card and string. Overall, they were very successful and surprisingly strong!

Impressively, the children were able to work together and show superb innovation.

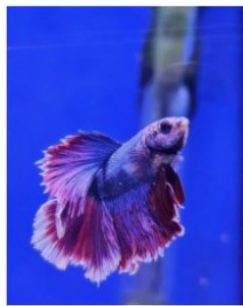

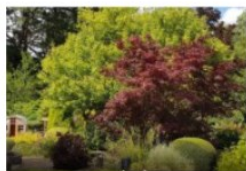

The PPG Committee are concerned about those Modality Mid Sussex patients with little, or no, ability to utilise modern technology (smart phones, tablets etc) which is vital when communicating with all health centres in our area and the wider NHS services.

We have been exploring various ways that we can help these patients and have been working with Age UK in East Grinstead, who provide a **FREE DROP-IN SERVICE** which includes basic 1-1 tutoring in using smart phones and tablets.

We are also exploring possible ways of making access to smart phones and tablets available to those patients that do not own one, and organising some tutoring sessions to use this technology.

HONORARY TREASURER NEEDED

St Leonard's Church Turners Hill is looking for an Honorary Treasurer to take over from the current retiring Treasurer.

The Treasurer is responsible for the management and safe-keeping of the finances of the Church. In a normal month there will be about 35 transactions.

The Treasurer manages income from sources such as direct debits, church offertory plate collections, ad hoc donations and grants. In addition, recording and allocating monies received in respect of weddings, funerals and baptisms. Gift Aid claims are made quarterly. Expenses and contracts with utility companies to be monitored. It is also a requirement that the Treasurer is a member of the Parochial Church Council (PCC) and is responsible to that body.

Annually, the Treasurer compiles the Annual Financial Report and arranges for it to be independently examined and submitted to the Charity Commission and the Diocese of Chichester. Reports and updates will be required for the quarterly Fabric & Finance and PCC meetings.

Previous experience as a Treasurer is essential, together with a knowledge of accruals, accounting methods, financial planning and forecasting. The current Treasurer is happy to provide some training and also a comprehensive handover.

All members of the PCC are required to undertake the Diocese of Chichester's online Safeguarding training.

"My life as an Engineer" was the topic of Lorraine Fitzwater's talk on 6th June. Lorraine explained to us that she had had to overcome adversity working as a chemical engineer in a male dominated industry. Lorraine was born in Australia, but moved to the UK in 1979. She has worked in a number of countries in the oil and gas industry and these include - Algeria, Russia, Romania, Norway and Dubai. She explained that in her early working years, separate facilities for women in the workplace were almost non existent and this had caused her many problems. However, attitudes towards women have completely changed over the years and they now receive the respect that they deserve. Lorraine explained that at present, 18% of chemical engineers in the UK are women. We certainly learned a great deal about a subject we knew little about.

At our July meeting, Gilly Halcrow entertained us with a fascinating story about A.A. Milne and his wife, Dorothy de Selincourt, who he married in London in 1913. Gilly explained that they were both from very privileged backgrounds. They married in 1913 and Christopher Robin was born in 1920. He became the basis of the character in the Christopher Robin books which his father wrote for him. The Walt Disney Company also made a number of animated films from the books which were very successful.

Christopher had a very happy childhood living in Hartfield where he was looked after by his Nanny. She took him walking in Ashdown Forest where they spent many happy hours exploring. Unfortunately, he had a miserable time in boarding school being teased and bullied about the books. After attending University and serving in the army, he married Lesley, who was a first cousin. They went on to have one much loved daughter. They settled happily in Devon where they bought a bookshop. Sadly, Christopher had very little communication with his parents during their final years. Gilly was an excellent speaker who held our attention throughout her talk.

Our next meeting is on Thursday 1st August when Ben Cross will tell us about the British Alstromeria and UK cut flower industry.

We welcomed over 100 people into the church for a fantastic celebration.

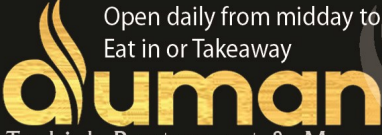

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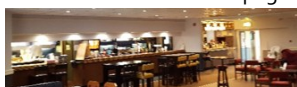
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
