"The Crop Circle Mystery" - this was the presentation by our guest speaker, Andy Thomas, at our zoom meeting on 4th February. Andy had become interested in this subject whilst on holiday in Wiltshire in 1991 when he saw his first crop circle. He discovered that some were man-made, but that many were unexplained phenomenon, visually stunning and with very intricate patterns. They were best viewed from above in order to get the full impact of their designs. Many theories had been put forward about crop circles, but Andy confirmed that there was no scientific evidence of their being created by UFOs. This was a really fascinating presentation which gave us all food for thought.

The history of Standen gardens with plans for the future was James Masters' topic at our meeting on 4th March. James is the Head Gardener of the estate and lives in an old farm cottage near the main house. We saw some beautiful photographs of Standen through the seasons and heard that there were extensive plans to improve some areas and to restore others which had been neglected. The National Trust took ownership of the estate in 1972. The house had been built by the Beale family, but it was Margaret Beale who had been instrumental in the original design of the gardens. It was a really enjoyable talk which was made all the more pleasurable because most of us knew Standen very well.

ALL IN THE MONTH OF APRIL

It was:

1900 years ago, on 26th April 121 that Marcus Aurelius, Emperor of Rome (161-180AD) and Stoic philosopher (whose works are still read today), was born. He was the last of the rulers known as the Five Good Emperors, and the last emperor of the Pax Romana, an age of relative peace and stability for the Roman Empire.

300 years ago, on 3rd April 1721 that Robert Walpole became the first British Prime Minister.

250 years ago, on 13th April 1771 that Richard Trevithick, British mining engineer and inventor of the first steam locomotive, was born.

125 years ago, from 6th to 15th April 1896 that the first modern Summer Olympic Games were held in Athens. The original Olympics were banned by the Roman Emperor Theodosius (I or II) in either 393 or 426 AD.

95 years ago, on 21st April 1926 that Queen Elizabeth II was born in Mayfair, London. Elizabeth Alexandra Mary Windsor was the first child of the Duke and Duchess of York. Her father became King on the abdication of his brother King Edward VIII in 1936, from which time Elizabeth was the heir presumptive.

90 years ago, on 14th April 1931 that the first edition of the Highway Code was published in the UK.

70 years ago, on 17th April 1951 that the Peak District National Park was established. It was Britain's first national park.

50 years ago, on 6th April 1971 that Igor Stravinsky, Russian composer, died. He was one of the most important and influential composers of the 20th century.

20 years ago, on 7th April 2001 that NASA launched its Mars Odyssey spacecraft to search for evidence of life and volcanic activity on Mars. It went into orbit around Mars and remains operational (though it will run out of propellant in 2025). It is the longest surviving continually active spacecraft orbiting another planet. It has successfully mapped the distribution of water below the surface and discovered a vast amount of ice below the equatorial regions.

10 years ago, on 29th April 2011 that the wedding of Prince William and Catherine (Kate) Middleton took place at Westminster Abbey in London. They were given the titles the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge.

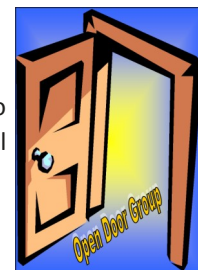

WORTH ABBEY NEWS : APRIL - MAY 2021

Worth Abbey is open for Mass and private prayer in line with government guidelines.

There are three Masses during the week - Saturday at 5pm, The Vigil Mass for Sunday at 9.30am and Tuesday at 10am.

You are welcome to participate remembering that maintaining social distancing does limit the space available. Track and Trace is operating, or you can register using a form when you arrive at the church. **Please wear a face covering and use the hand sanitiser provided.**

Should you wish to stream the Parish Mass at 5pm on Saturday, the code is <https://vimeo.com/event/597192>. Your presence at this mass will be assumed to signify your agreement with streaming. If you do not wish to be visible, please avoid the two front benches around the church.

The church will be open for private prayer at 2pm on Thursday when there will also be the opportunity for confession. The entrance for private prayer will be via the East Door (on the lower level) not from the Narthex. **Confession is also available on Sunday morning at 9am** (prior to Mass) in the Unity Room.

Do please **remember the Quiet Garden here at Worth** which is a lovely spot for prayer and reflection (follow the signs from the main car park).

Palm Sunday : Concelebrated Mass Sunday 28th March, at 9.30am

Good Friday : Concelebrated Celebration of the Lord's Passion 2nd April at 3.00pm

Easter Vigil : Concelebrated Mass Saturday 3rd April at 9.00pm

Easter Sunday : Parish Mass 4th April at 9.30am

Easter Sunday : Monastic Easter Morning Mass with congregation 4th April at 11.30

Please check the Parish website if attending any of these masses in case last minute changes have been made. **We regret that because of social distancing, there will be a limit on numbers. Those attending must register via the parish website and priority will be given to Worth Abbey parishioners. Entry will be by ticket only.** Masses can be watched via live streaming if there are no longer places available. Please visit the parish website for up to date information.
