RELATIONSHIPS OF LOVE

Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day coincide on the calendar this year. Valentine's Day is about romantic love, candlelit dinners and red roses. Ash Wednesday, as the doorway to the season of Lent, asks that through penance, prayer and simplicity we commit our focus to God.

In a sense both celebrations are about keeping passion alive through communication, sacrifice and love.

In relationships of human love we learn to speak honestly to each other, sharing our hopes and fears, our disappointments and dreams. We listen to one another and grow in trust. Sometimes we give up our own priorities, preferences and pleasures for the good of others. Human love also thrives on spontaneity – a kind word, or a thoughtful gift or gesture. And sometimes within these relationships we need to seek and give forgiveness too.

These activities of communication, sacrifice and love – run parallel to the hallmarks of Lent too. For this season is about nurturing our relationship with God where prayer, fasting and good works are key.

Prayer is the gift of communication with God where hopes and fears, disappointments and dreams can be shared. As we listen for God, we seek to know Him more clearly, love him more dearly and follow him more nearly. Silence is an essential element of the spiritual life, for it quiets the heart, mind and soul, allowing God to break through the noise of our culture.

During Lent we may give up or sacrifice something - crisps, chocolate, coffee, alcohol, technology, grumbling! - or we may take up something new such as giving our time to a cause or activity that helps others. We might also seek reconciliation with those from whom we have become alienated. These things aim to increase our focus beyond ourselves, allow us to share our blessings and fix our gaze on God.

Faith is nothing more than our longing for God, and his for us. And like any romance, it has to be nurtured and nourished if it is to prosper and grow. May our hearts be ready to keep a Holy Lent where wholeness is sought and broken hearts heal through deeper relationship with God.

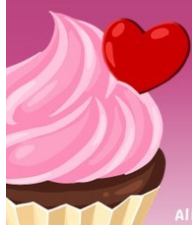

 **1ST TURNERS HILL AND CRAWLEY DOWN SCOUT GROUP**

OUR 75TH ANNIVERSARY YEAR

There is some recorded evidence of Scouts being attached to the churches existing in both the villages of Turners Hill (1914) and Crawley Down (1910). However, the first official registration of the 1st Turners Hill Scout Group was in 1949 with the Rev William Harfield as Group Scout Leader, Phyllis Webber as Wolf Cub Pack Leader and Mr T R Leigh as Scout Troop Leader. The Cub and Scout meetings were held in the "old" Ark at the school and this was used until the Group erected its own Headquarters in Crawley Down in 1980. In 1974 the Group added Crawley Down to its title to reflect the membership growth from there.

How many of you have memories of your Scouting days?

Do you remember the original uniform including the 4 dented, flat brimmed, khaki coloured hat, the shorts and long socks?

Or even the yellow braided green Cub cap?

Were you a Senior Scout or a member of Rover Scout Crew?

What badges/awards did you gain? Tenderpad, Tenderfoot or were you a 1st Class Scout?

Here in 2024 some things have not changed much. Our young people still gain badges and awards, still go camping, hiking, light fires and do cooking, but there are modern things as well such as: computer skills, environmental issues, space exploration and World affairs.

Great news! We have found enough volunteers to enable the Group to open a **SQUIRREL SCOUT DREY** (this is the new section of Scouting for the 4 to 6 years age group) but we are still **DESPERATE FOR VOLUNTEERS FOR BEAVER, CUB AND SCOUT SECTIONS.**

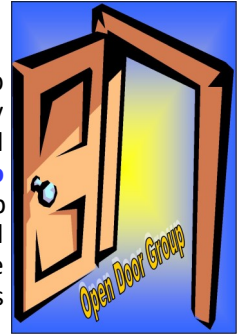

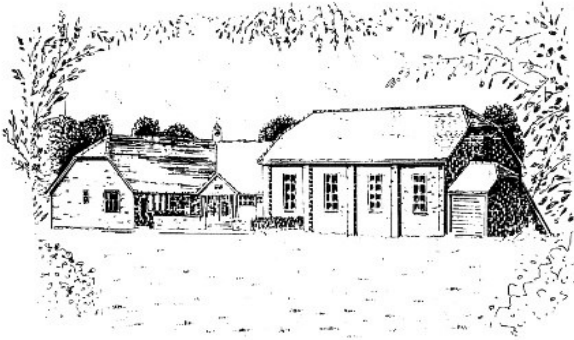

THANK YOU

Turners Hill Parish Council would like to thank the Paddockhurst Estate for once again donating a beautiful Christmas Tree to the Village and would also like to thank the Fire Service who gave up their time to put the tree up and take it down.

COUNCIL TAX 2024-25

As you know Mid Sussex District Council collects the Council Tax on behalf of themselves, West Sussex County Council, Sussex Police and individual Parish Councils. This money is used for the services provided by each of these groups and details are circulated annually by MSDC.

For the coming year the amount you will pay for the Parish Council will, on a Band D property (the average amount), be £138.74 per year or £2.67 per week. This is a small increase of £11.11 per year or 22p per week. These funds allow us to run the Council in line with Government legislation, pay for our street lights and any repairs to them, maintain the pond and allotment site, pay for the emptying of dog bins, and a minimal amount goes towards maintaining The Ark (which is almost entirely self-funded).

Whilst ensuring that we can achieve all this we have been mindful of not increasing our budget by too great a percentage and hope you agree that we are being prudent but proactive on your behalf. We did not increase the budget last year, so we hope that this balances out this year's increase.

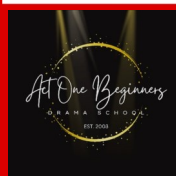

Worth Parish Council Update

PARISH COUNCIL STAFF RETIRING

At the end of the year, the Council said goodbye to two long serving members of staff. John Smith, our groundsman, was a familiar sight to residents as he helped keep both villages tidy, and the Crawley Down allotment site maintained. John has been with the Council for nearly 30 years, so will be missed by many.

Ellen Smith, our Finance Officer, also left the Council after ten years in post. Many did not realise that she is John's wife, so we hope that they will enjoy their retirement together.

ALLOTMENT GATE CODE HAS CHANGED

The Crawley Down Allotment gate code was changed on Monday 8th January 2024. All allotment tenants in Crawley Down and Crowthorne will have been notified with the new code.

CCTV

Work is currently taking place to prepare for the installation of CCTV cameras in the Parish. It is proposed that four CCTV cameras are fitted initially – two in Crawley Down and two in Crowthorne. In Crawley Down they will be located by the Play Area and on the corner of Burleigh Way, and in Crowthorne they will be located by the Recreation Ground and the Village Green. Once installed, these cameras will be monitored in the Control Room of Sussex Police to support the prevention, investigation and detection of crime, the apprehension and prosecution of offenders, the maintenance of public order and the reduction of vandalism.

We are keen to sort out the **CAR PARK BEHIND THE VILLAGE SHOPS** and have asked Mid Sussex District Council (MSDC) to take action to remove the dumped rubbish. We are also appalled by the recent spate of **FLY-TIPPING**.

Sadly, the glass from the **BUS SHELTER** had to be removed due to vandalism and will not be replaced. One culprit has been identified and we are seeking remedies for reparation.

On a positive note, our **MEMORIAL BENCH** will soon appear on the grass next to The Royal Oak pub. Our ageing **NOTICEBOARDS** are set to be replaced; we are seeking something that is a more eye-catching and robust.

With spring cleaning in mind, we are looking for lots of volunteers to join our **LITTERPICK** on **Saturday 23rd March from 10-12pm**. If you would like to join us, please meet in the car park opposite the shops at 10am.

The scheme for more **PARKING IN BOWERS PLACE** continues to move forward. Meetings have been held to try to resolve the issues with West Sussex County Council (WSCC) which have caused delays.

Now this is underway we are hoping to improve and extend the **VILLAGE GREEN PLAYGROUND**. This will be partly financed by dedicated Section 106 money given by developers to the village, and we also hope to attract financial support from other community funds. Look out for a competition asking our local children for their suggestions and ideas.

It is great to see the improvements to the **VILLAGE POND**. Councillor Sue Kipps has been putting the pressure on WSCC, which owns it, to restore this much-loved feature to its attractive past. WSCC says the assessment for the silting issues is still work in progress.

Finally, we would like to thank our nominations for this year's **PARISH AWARDS** scheme. Our mystery post box knitter, John Sullivan from the Christmas Lights Committee and Andrew Metcalfe from Crawley Down Residents Association have all being put forward for recognition of their hard work and contribution to village life.

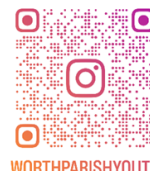

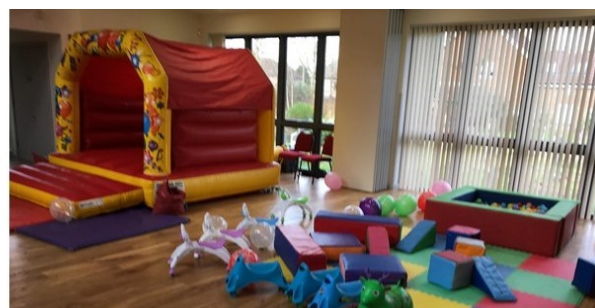

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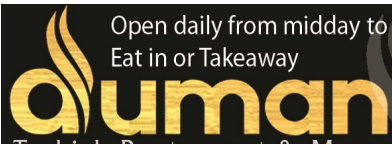


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
