A TOUCH OF BIRTHDAY SPIRIT

The Festival of Pentecost this year falls on 8th June and although not recognised as such, it's perhaps the most exciting of the Christian festivals for it marks the moment when God started the church. So, in essence Pentecost is a birthday festival.

The Bible tells us that Jesus talks about this moment with his disciples – when God will send the Holy Spirit to inspire and empower ordinary Christians to do extraordinary things for Him.

In some bible translations Jesus describes the Holy Spirit as 'The Comforter' -

"But I will send you the Comforter—the Holy Spirit" John 15:26

When we think of comfort we might imagine the luxuries of life, or being wrapped up in a warm duvet (maybe not in the summer heat we've been experiencing as I write this!) or being consoled when we are upset or in need. However what Jesus means when He speaks of the Holy Spirit is a 'strengthening' or 'stirring into action'. Thinking about the coming of the Holy

Spirit in this way makes much more sense of both Jesus words to His disciples and what we read about in the book of Acts as the early church begins to develop and spread - *"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."* Acts 1:8

The Holy Spirit comes as a free gift from God for all to receive in order that we might know God's presence with us as we live out our faith on a daily basis.

It's on the day of Pentecost, 50 days after Easter Sunday, that the Holy Spirit takes the group of timid and bewildered disciples and equips them to declare the good news message. The 'Comforter' then, is not sent for our own benefit or to make us feel better but is the power of God that enables us to build one another up and to inspire the Church today.

As Pentecost approaches perhaps we need to re-assess this great Christian Festival and celebrate the birthday of the church with a lot more enthusiasm!

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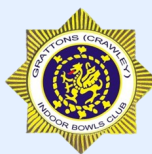

YEAR 1 : CASTLES AND THE NATURAL WORLD



Year 1 had a very busy Spring Term - we learned all about castles. We visited Hever Castle and had a wonderful time.

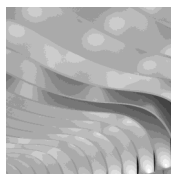

MEET THE MENDERS AT FOREST ROW REPAIR CAFÉ

REPAIR CAFÉ

Forest Row

As part of an ongoing series, Fleur Britten introduces the brainy IT repair team.

Tucked away in our drawers, cupboards and got-to-sort-out piles is a nationwide hoard of broken devices – from phones that won't charge, to laptops with sticking keyboards and tablets with cracked screens. According to businesswaste.co.uk, around 20% of all electronic devices in UK homes are unused, slowly slipping into obsolescence because we just don't know what to do with them.

What's more, a new survey by Una Watch found that 47% of us would rather buy a new device than try to fix a broken one. This means that huge amounts are being discarded – UK households produce over 400,000 tonnes of e-waste each year (in fact, e-waste is the world's fastest-growing solid waste stream), with only 31.2% being recycled. As well as the loss of recyclable rare-earth materials, e-waste is also an eco hazard, with toxic elements (eg. lead, mercury and cadmium) potentially leaching into the soil and water.

Enter the Forest Row Repair Café, or more specifically, our wonderful IT volunteers! Keith Weir, a retired computer specialist, has worked on operating system and distributed systems development, network communications and standards; Nic Gibson is a technical account manager specialising in server and database technologies and other matters too complex for us to grasp. His very capable son, Peter, also often helps out. Together, they've saved countless devices from landfill.

Computers are their speciality, whether it's installing necessary software, fixing bugs, resolving password problems and printer jams, diagnosing why computers keep crashing or run so slowly, or advising on new parts needed, where to buy them, and even helping customers fit them, too. They'll also help with tablets and phones, advising on software fixes or settings problems, though – Keith warns, "these repairs often require micro-soldering, which is best done by specialist repairers – but we may be able to point you in the right direction." ("Printers, annoyingly, have a lower success rate, due to their 'complexity'", Keith explains.)

As with all our Repair Café volunteers, the IT team brings a can-do spirit: "It's worth trying us on anything," says Keith. "We can always say if it's beyond us."

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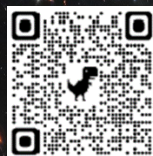
CRAWLEY ASTRONOMICAL SOCIETY

Is your interest Astronomy and would you like to meet fellow enthusiasts? If it is, then come and join us at Crawley Astronomical Society.

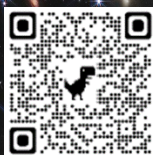

CRAWLEY DOWN CCTV

We are currently awaiting confirmation of installation dates for the new CCTV column and 3 cameras (1 pan tilt zoom and 2 fixed cameras) to be installed on Station Road in Crawley Down and for the CCTV signs to be put up. For more information and the latest news please see our website.

SPEEDING IN THE VILLAGE

Speedwatch are still in desperate need of volunteers and are appealing for more to come forward. Being a volunteer can involve as little as one hour every two or three weeks, although if you'd like to do more that would of course be welcomed. Alternatively, you can email Steve O'Connell of Sussex Police at stephen.oconnell@sussex.police.uk

They now have 2,500 volunteers across Sussex, with 190 Parish Councils and 15 Wardens carrying out Community Speedwatch initiatives. They issue 5,000 letters per month to drivers for speeding; from this they only have a repeat offender rate of less than 5% out of the 60,000 or so letters sent over the year, which means drivers really do take notice.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN REVIEWS

Worth Parish Council is currently in the process of reviewing the Crawley Down Neighbourhood Plan. A consultation was recently undertaken with residents, businesses, organisations and other stakeholders in the village which asked questions on how effective each policy is. We are now undertaking a Housing Survey to gain an up-to-date understanding of the demographic and what current needs exist in the village around housing. It follows a Housing Survey which was undertaken in 2019. The output of this consultation will enable us to consider how the plan can be used to address local needs. The survey will be available in a paper copy as well as an online form.

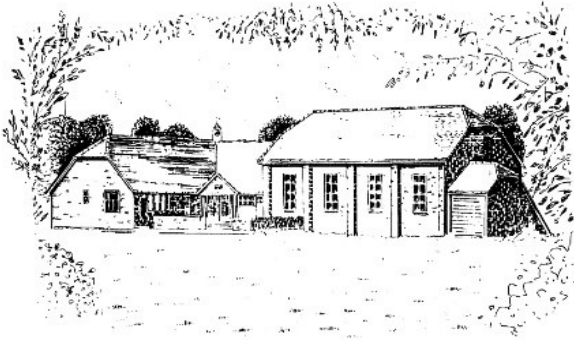

SUMMARY OF ANNUAL REPORT OF THE PARISH COUNCIL 2024/25

We are ending the 2025 Council year with a full complement of councillors. Welcome to Frankie Lutman, who joined us at the March meeting. We also welcome Charlotte as our Parish Clerk and Elaine as Assistant Clerk. Thank you to all of you for your time and dedication to the role.

We have made some good progress with completing projects this year - the *Safer Routes to School* project in Lion Lane has been approved by West Sussex County Council (WSCC) as has the additional School Crossing Patroller in Church Road. We are currently in discussion with WSCC regarding the possible installation of Vehicle Activated Signs on roads into the village.

We are delighted to present the **CIVIC AWARD TO STUART BEARE** who has been a great support to the village and Parish over many years.

We continue to deal with all the normal issues such as:

- donations/contributions to : St Leonard's Church for the upkeep of the Churchyard, the *Two Villages* Community Magazine which allows us to share information with residents, grants for village organisations and charities
- subsidising local groups and charities so that they can have cheaper hire of The Ark
- management, maintenance and letting of The Ark

INSPIRING WOMEN

Our March meeting was our AGM where all our officers and committee agreed to carry on doing the good job that they are already doing. We had an enjoyable lunch and a game of bingo. There was also time for a good chat with everyone, something we always enjoying doing!

In April, Melanie Gibson-Barton came to speak to us on *"And So To Ted – a History of Teddies and Other Bears"*. Melanie showed us that Teddy Bears have been around since the beginning of the 20th Century from the association of Theodore 'Teddy' Roosevelt's bear in 1902 and the development of an upright jointed bear manufactured by Margarete Steiff's company in Germany in 1903. The talk included the well-loved British companies that began producing their own bears to compete with American and German bear manufacturers. Teddy Bears are seen as lifelong friends by both men and women, and are said to know the innermost secrets of their owners, often after being presented with their first bears as babies. 51% of adults still have their childhood bear! Research has shown that children identify qualities of their furry friends by believing that they too experience happiness, fears and joys in life. Melanie illustrated how Teddy Bears have been employed since the early years of the 20th century up to the present day in literature, entertainment, advertising, television and films. The talk included notable historic bears that achieved thousands at auction and bears that had been to war, and also followed the development from unhygienic and dangerous playthings to the fully washable, safe bears given to children today. Melanie provided pointers for identifying the age of teddy bears and members carefully examined their bears that they had brought along to hear the talk in the hope of discovering a premium bear, but then agreed that all their bears were priceless!

 CRAWLEY DOWN EVENING WI
INSPIRING WOMEN

We had a very interesting presentation on 3rd April entitled *"The History of Wakehurst"* by Paul Reader. He explained that the main building is a Grade I Elizabethan mansion and is built from sandstone. It has a rich history dating back to the 13th century. The estate has been owned by many families over the centuries, but it was eventually bequeathed to the National Trust in 1964 and entrusted to Kew in 1984.

Wakehurst covers 535 acres and, at the start of the 21st century, its doors opened for the first time to the most biodiverse place on the planet, the Millenium Seed Bank. Paul also highlighted that organising fundraising events is very important to ensure that the estate can continue its journey whilst giving pleasure to thousands of visitors each year. Paul is also a very fine wildlife photographer and has taken many photographs whilst out walking on the Wakehurst estate.

Mathew Homewood entertained us on 1st May with his talk on *"The Sporting History of Sussex : from the amazing to the bizarre!"* His presentation took a light-hearted look at the history of sporting events in Sussex. He explained that sport has been a key feature of Sussex life throughout the centuries. Cricket, football and horse racing were commonplace events, as well as the much-loved Sussex game of Stoolball. This game was played in Crawley Down for many years and can be traced back to at least the 15th century. However, local village sports days were also host to many lesser-known sporting activities, including : jingling matches, menagerie races and piano bashing. Mathew went into great detail about all these events in a very entertaining and informative way which was full of wonderful photographs; he was an excellent speaker.

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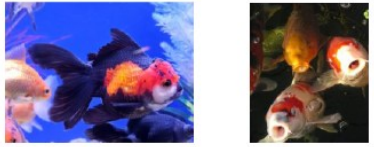



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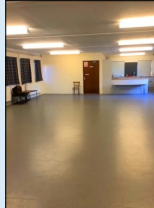

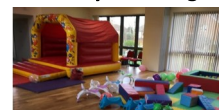
