THE CORONATION OF KING CHARLES III

Such pomp and pageantry, this was Great Britain at its very best. The magnificence of the crowns, the carriages and the jewels, the splendour of the robes and dresses and the display of grandeur from over 4,000 members of the Army, RAF, Royal Navy and Commonwealth forces were a sight to behold, whether royalist or not.

There have been 40 coronations held at Westminster Abbey since 1066 with only the boy King Edward V (died) and Edward VIII (abdicated) never being crowned. Lady Jane Grey was proclaimed queen and awaited coronation in the Tower of London, but was deposed 9 days later and never crowned.

The Church of England offer us this prayer for Their Majesties King Charles III and Queen Camilla:

Almighty God, the fountain of all goodness,
bless our Sovereign Lord, King Charles,
and all who are in authority under him;
that they may order all things
in wisdom and equity, righteousness and peace,
to the honour of your name,
and the good of your Church and people;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

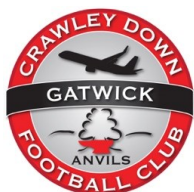

CRAWLEY DOWN GATWICK FC is firmly established within the local community. One of the main keys to our success, and what sets us apart from many other clubs, is that we are "one club" from the under-5s right through to the first team.

The first team have had a great season finishing runners up in the Premier Division of the Southern Combination Football League and qualifying for a one-off promotion play off match which unfortunately did not go our way. The junior section is thriving and one of our biggest problems these days is finding pitches and venues for all of the teams to train and play. The girls' section continues to be a great success and is now firmly established as an integral part of the Club. Those involved in it should be rightly proud of what they have achieved.

Despite our over 400 junior members, and our on-pitch success, **we struggle to attract bigger attendances to first team games.** During the season **we were top of the table for several weeks**, and challenging for the league title right up to the final round of matches, but we had the lowest average attendance in our division.

Children, accompanied by an adult, go FREE and at £7 for adults the entertainment on offer is great value.

We have just had our end of season Junior presentation evening which, as always, was a huge success despite the incessant rain. This year I am delighted to say that 1st Crawley Down & Turners Hill Scouts provided the barbecue. This meant that none of the junior teams had to get involved in the cooking and serving rota.

We are very grateful to our local Scouts Group for doing this. It is another good example of cooperation within the local community. The Football Club has a very good relationship with Crawley Down Community Centre Association and the Junior Presentation evening is a very important event for the Haven Bar.

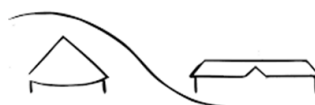
JOB VACANCY - PREMISES MANAGER

All our young people aged 6 to 14 enjoy the activities planned and run by our Leaders. These activities do not happen without the very small and very dedicated team of Leaders and, as with many organisations, **we repeat the plea for more volunteers to help so that we can continue to provide Scouting to the young people of both our villages.**

Many of the activities lead to them gaining their various awards and a badge to sew on their uniforms to show off their achievements. It is not all about badges and all sections have enjoyed meetings away from the Headquarters; these have included sleepovers, Fire station visits, Crazy Golf, Bouldering, Aeroball, Tomahawk throwing and Air Rifle shooting depending on their age. The favourite meetings seem to be anything that includes preparing and eating food! These have included pancakes, Chinese food and curries.

Although we are short of Leaders, because many members will be moving on to the next age section, we will be taking in 9 new Beaver Scouts in June but there are still more who want to join.

We spent a wet but enjoyable evening cooking the BBQ for the Crawley Down Football Club Junior Presentation evening and 50 members joined in the worldwide Jamboree on the Trail (the annual day for worldwide Scouts to go on a walk)

SO ... WHERE TO START ...

Your first priority should be to ensure that online accounts which involve payment information can be immediately closed down upon your death to prevent fraud or identity theft, or continued legitimate payments taken. These include banking, shopping/auction sites, utilities, telecoms, entertainment, gaming, gambling and dating sites. The respective companies or sites should be able to advise on what course of action to take. There are a number of ways to help ensure that digital assets will not get lost after your death. Have a look at the Get Safe Online website at www.getsafeonline.org/personal/articles/digital-legacies.

The main thing to remember is to include your wishes regarding all or individual accounts in your Will – including logins and other access details – and lodging it securely with your solicitor.

Not many people think about this, or the consequences to those who succeed them if they are lost, or if the online accounts associated with them are simply deleted. If you want to protect the assets and your successors, you really should make provision by leaving a digital legacy.

What are the risks of NOT having a digital legacy?

All of those precious memories in the form of photos, videos and favourite music libraries – as well as posts, comments and conversations on social media – will be inaccessible to family and friends, and possibly lost for all time. Successors may be unable to maintain links with close contacts as they cannot gain access to them. And on a more practical level, they may not be able to close accounts – including bank, credit card, building society and online store accounts – held in your name.

A MESSAGE FROM THE CDRA COMMITTEE

We wanted to thank everyone who continued to support the Crawley Down Residents Association. Run by a small group of volunteers, the organisation does its best to help the community as best it can. Whilst in recent years we have helped doing various things, it cannot be argued that our primary function is be organising and running events for our community throughout the year.

This involves a lot of planning, risk assessments (fire, health, safety, security etc) and then ensuring that appropriate measures are in place. Wherever possible, we try and ensure these measures are discreet and that they do not impact the event greatly.

In planning for this year's Gig on the Green however, a number of risks were identified which could only be addressed by controlling access to it - as many of you will already be aware the 2023 event will be enclosed and tickets needed (visit gigonthegreen.cdra.info for tickets). We will review how it goes after this year, and make any adjustments necessary for 2024. For more information on event security please read the article on our website www.cdra.info.

EVERYTHING WE DO IS FUNDED BY THE £5 PER HOUSEHOLD PER YEAR MEMBERSHIP FEE, FUNDRAISING EFFORTS, GRANTS AND DONATIONS. We currently have around a fifth of households which is a great achievement and we will continue our drive to increase membership. If your household is not yet a member please consider joining, you needn't volunteer your time to help if you don't want to but every extra household makes a small contribution to our significant annual costs. For context, in the last financial year the **CDRA'S OPERATING COSTS WERE £35,826.27.**

Gill Bailey's talk on 13th April was entitled "The History of Hats". Gill's career in hats first started when she worked for Felicity Hat Hire in Caterham. When she relocated to East Grinstead in 2000, she opened a shop in Felbridge. Due to her experience in the millinery trade, she is well able to advise her clients on the style of headwear which is most suited to them. Gill has an extensive range of headwear which she has purchased from well-known designers. She explained that hats had been worn since medieval times and were an accepted headwear. By the 1600s, they became more extravagant with ribbons, netting and even feathers being added. Moving on to the 1980s, hats were mainly worn for formal occasions. However, when the Princess of Wales became a fashion icon, her style was much admired and copied. This in turn had the effect of reviving the wearing of hats and fascinators. Gill had brought a selection of very colourful and stylish headwear for members to try on. Finally, there were scarves and umbrellas for sale at very reasonable prices. It was a very enjoyable presentation.

In May, retired geography teacher, Bill Avenall, showed us slides of iconic views of Sussex. He was unlike any geography teacher I had ever encountered! His presentation was energetic, entertaining and informative. With a booming voice, Bill firstly talked about the South Downs Fulking Escarpment which has a wonderful viewpoint, but also some of the steepest slopes in West Sussex. On the coast, he explained the geography and geology of West Wittering and Bosham which are situated near Chichester. 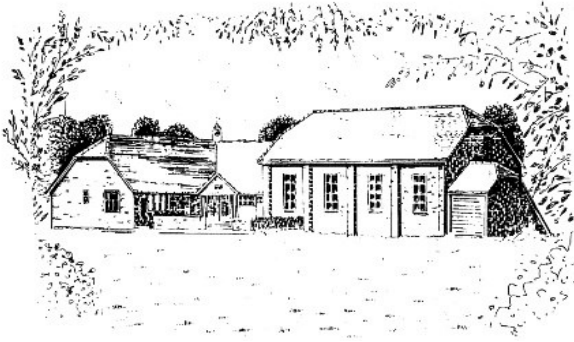
Our meeting on 24th May will be a "Coronation Cream Tea"; a belated chance for us to celebrate the recent events and we will also have a "Royal Quiz".

It has been an absolute pleasure serving as Chair of the Council for the last two years, although it can sometimes be a thankless task! I am so proud of the progress we have made as a Council in this term and sincerely hope the progress continues into the next term and beyond. In this term we have expanded our team of officers to widen our skill set and improve capacity. This in turn has allowed us to progress projects such as the CCTV provision and Bowers Place parking which were delayed due to COVID and the proposed Council split. These are now progressing to a conclusion in the near future and other projects such as the Copthorne Rec and the Crawley Down shop fronts are starting to gain momentum. We have employed a Youth Worker who is a vital addition to our team and has been instrumental in us setting up Youth Clubs in both villages – this was an extremely important goal for the Council in this term. We have also promoted a Grounds Supervisor who is putting together a plan for how we maintain and improve our 'estate' going forward. I am 100% confident this will lead to big changes in maintenance around the villages that will be pleasing to all our eyes.

Looking forward into the next term, I would like to take this opportunity to urge ALL residents to get more involved with the

Council. Know who your local Councillors are, interact with them to understand what the Council is doing and how it works for you. Get involved with either the CDRA (Crawley Down Residents Association) in Crawley Down or the CCG (Copthorne Community Group) in Copthorne to ensure that the Council is acting in everyone's interests, not just a few. But more than anything, please understand that ALL your local Councillors are residents like yourself and volunteer their time – evenings and during the days – to work for our villages. Your support will make this all the easier and more pleasurable. We all want the same things, I promise you.

So now I will hang up my chains and keep my fingers crossed that I will be present at the Annual Council Meeting on 15 May where a new set of committees and Chairs will be elected to start work on the next 4-year plan. I will finish by thanking all my fellow Councillors and especially the staff of Worth Parish Council for their help and support during this last term.

We were very pleased with the response by older children to the cooking experience events run at both Copthorne and Crawley Down at the Glebe Centre so we will be arranging more of these. In the meantime on 28 July we have arranged a **"Chef on the Farm"** away-day for 13-16 year olds. You may have noticed the green electricity supply cabinet by the park on the village green. This is part of our project to install an **electricity supply on the green** to support local events.

weather was good, and the younger children enjoyed the funfair rides and the children's games area. The day, organised by a small group led by new Councillor, Thérèse Wilson, showcased The Haven Centre and the facilities there. It culminated in a lively curry night and disco.

The Council is also supporting the CDRA who are running the Gig on the Green on 29 July and the Crawley Down Village Fayre on the 9 September.

The **project to install CCTV in Crawley Down and Copthorne** is underway and this will help to reduce criminal and anti-social activity in The Parish. The cameras will be monitored by Sussex Police so that they can respond quickly and effectively to any suspicious activities. We stress that this is not "active surveillance" as such, but augmentation of the regular PCSO presence in the area to gain evidence in the event of any follow up police action.

Parish and District Council Elections were held on 4 May. We say goodbye and thanks to Roger Webb, John Hitchcock and Chris Mayor and welcome Thérèse Wilson, Peter Bingle and Sue Kipps. We congratulate our District Councillors John Hitchcock and Ian Gibson who were elected to Mid Sussex District Council. We look forward to even better support there.

Message from your Local PCSOs

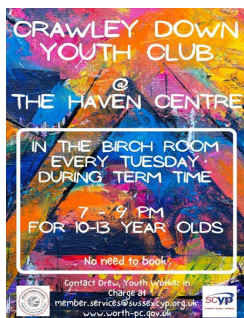
