HOPE IN COMMUNITY

"The kingdom of God is near you." (Luke 10:8)

It was good to be at the Village Fayre in September as the Crawley Down community came together to spend time outdoors and enjoy the day. Thanks must go to all involved for all the work put in to make it happen. This month we remember St Luke (18th October), the author of the third Gospel and Book of Acts. One of the messages of Luke's Gospel is about building community in Christ. Throughout his writing Luke makes clear the good news of God's salvation, hope and grace. Also, as we remember St Luke on the 18th, we give thanks for all frontline healthcare workers who have given so much to care for others over the last eighteen months.

It is believed that Luke was a doctor, so he sees the importance of healing in the ministry of Jesus and the Church. His gospel includes a message of hope and healing. This is evident when Jesus sends out the 72 in Luke 10, a reading for St Luke's Day: *"The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field... When you enter a town and are welcomed, eat what is set before you. Heal the sick who are there and tell them, 'The kingdom of God is near you'."* (Luke 10:2,8). Luke throughout his Gospel recognises the revolutionary way Jesus builds community during his ministry of earth and as an evangelist, Luke calls us to live the Gospel wherever we are in community, and this must be rooted in prayer. As Rowan Williams states: *"Mission is seeing what God is doing and joining in"*.

In joining in, we find that hope that is found in Jesus: He has a complete knowledge of the workings of creation. Our hope for the future lies in what Jesus has done and continues to do in the world. He is the one who sustains creation and will bring everything to completion. So, even in the midst of the uncertainties and struggles of life, we can find our hope in him. Thus, we focus on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith over the next season of giving thanks and remembering before Advent approaches in December. *"For in Him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together"*. (Colossians 1:16,17)

A JOINT BENEFICE BETWEEN ALL SAINTS' CRAWLEY DOWN & ST LEONARD'S TURNERS HILL

As a result of Bishop Martin Warner's visitation across the Diocese in 2014, a review group was convened in 2015 to consider the future pattern of ministry in Crawley and Horsham. This was done with particular reference to both existing structures and increased housing provision within the area.

The review group was chaired by the Archdeacon of Horsham, assisted by an experienced Rural Dean and an external Deanery treasurer. Following extensive research over several months, involving visits to all parishes within the scope of the review, the Horsham and Crawley parish review was released. Changes were proposed for some parishes in the Deanery, which included the recommendation that the parishes of All Saints', Crawley Down and St Leonard's, Turners Hill eventually join to form one benefice.

Over the last year, the Parochial Church Councils (PCCs) of both parishes have been meeting for discussion and planning purposes in preparation for the formulation of the new joint benefice later this year. With the retirement of Canon David Tickner in November this year, the joint benefice will come into effect from 1st December 2021.

Some aspects of how the new benefice will operate are still being finalised, however updates regarding services and activities will be placed on both parish websites in due course.

As vicar I look forward, with both parish communities, to helping the church continue to broaden its mission and outreach, as we take this new step into our journey as one benefice into the future.

CRAWLEY DOWN VILLAGE WEBSITE ASSOCIATION GRANTS 2021

"Due to COVID". Don't you just hate those three words?!

At the end of 2020 we tried to make donations to local groups as we have every year since the website was launched but, unsurprisingly "due to COVID", there were no applications.

If organisations were not operating, then perhaps they had no need for a bit of extra funding?

Now it looks as though some sort of normality is returning. Importantly the Crawley Down Village Magazine is back in print and being hand delivered to all households in the Crawley Down area, so we are again inviting local organisations to apply to us for a small grant.

Readers of Crawley Down Village Magazine (formerly "Church & Village") will remember that when the website was first planned, we pledged that we would use all monies received from sponsors to donate to "worthy causes" in Crawley Down. True to our word, to date the **WEBSITE ASSOCIATION HAS MADE GRANTS TOTALLING £23,705**. At the end of 2021, the Crawley Down Village website (www.crawleydownvillage.co.uk) will have been in existence for 16 years.

The eligibility criteria for applying for a grant are simple - your group must be located in Crawley Down and must be specifically setup for the benefit of some or all of Crawley Down. Your organisation must be run on charitable lines and be predominately run by volunteers. **Previous applicants, whether successful or not, may apply again this year.**

In early December a meeting will be held to review the applications and decide on the recipients and the amounts to be awarded. Please note that not every applicant will be successful.

In previous years we have held a social evening at the Haven Centre where the names of the recipients were revealed. However, thanks to COVID, at this time we do not know the format - it could be simply phone calls to them, maybe a ZOOM meeting or, hopefully, back in the Oak Room at the Haven Centre.

We will again be making payments by bank transfer and this will mean that your group, if successful, will have the grant in their bank account the day after the presentation evening.

Chairman's Report

This month I have invited Kerry Scott, Vice Chair of the Council and a Crawley Down Councillor, to inform residents about the possible Community Governance Review.

Community Governance Review - A note from the Vice Chair

There has been a lot of Facebook activity on the Crawley Down Village Site about the Petition that Councillor Ian Gibson has circulated that seeks to create a separate Parish Council for Crawley Down thus splitting the existing Worth Parish into separate Parish Councils. If the Petition gains signatures from 10% of the electorate in Crawley Down, it will be considered by Mid Sussex District Council who will conduct a "Community Governance Review".

Originally, the Petition contained, as endorsers, six of the nine Parish Councillors representing Crawley Down. There was little information in the Petition about the costs and practical issues involved in creating the proposed Crawley Down Parish Council such as staffing, location, funding or dealing with the legal ramifications of splitting a Parish Council. As these issues emerged, two of the original six Councillors withdrew their support.

Since the Petition was launched, the Chair, Tony Dorey, a Copthorne Councillor, and myself as Vice Chair, a Crawley Down Councillor, have discussed the implications of a potential split and taken advice from both the West Sussex Association of Local Councils and also our consultants in HR issues. Their conclusion is that there would be a significant extra financial burden that would fall on the residents of Worth Parish, both in Copthorne and Crawley Down, through an unavoidable increase in the Parish Precept. Furthermore, the Crawley Down Infrastructure and Environment Working Party of Crawley Down Councillors and other key stakeholders in the Village, that was formed in late 2020, is proving effective and sufficiently funded to be able

to perform all the activities that the Petition suggests are lacking. Copthorne has a parallel working party with Copthorne Councillors, which is proving similarly effective.

Many of the initiatives identified by both Working Parties are likely to be lost during the next few years should energy and resources be directed towards an organisational change.

There are many other factors to take into account too, where the existing Council benefits from economies of scale and access to specialist assistance.

Worth Parish Council formally discussed this matter at its last meeting on 6th September. It was agreed that open public meetings will be held in Crawley Down and Copthorne so that all Electors in both Villages can be informed of the benefits and disadvantages of creating a Parish Council for Crawley Down. No referendum will be held - ultimately, Mid Sussex DC will conduct any Community Governance Review required and consultations that they feel should be carried out, and will then unilaterally decide the outcome. Copthorne residents will be included in this consultation process, as they too will be affected should Crawley Down break away.

To that end, there will be a **public meeting** held in the **Haven Centre, Crawley Down, on Friday, 1st October**, commencing at 7pm. This will be chaired by an independent person, and opinions from both sides will be considered and discussed. A similar meeting will be held in Copthorne, the date of this will be advertised when available.

Crawley Down Play Area Roundabout

The replacement roundabout is on order. However, you may have heard in the press that there is a shortage of raw materials. This means that delivery has been delayed due to manufacturing issues, but we hope to have it installed by the end of September.

Crawley Down Environment Group and Infrastructure Working Party

Although it has been the holiday season, the Crawley Down Environment & Infrastructure Working Party has been active during the last two months on several issues:

A very constructive meeting was held with the agents for the owners of some of the freeholds of the shops and surrounding areas such as the car park accessed from Old Station Close. The objective is to improve the look of the area, and the car park, and provide better opportunities there.

Additional pressure has been applied to Sussex Safer Roads Partnership to solve the speeding and anti-social driving problems in the Village particular on the Turners Hill Road. The Chief Constable of Sussex has been most helpful in this.

Contact has been made with Community Transport Sussex and, together with our colleagues on the Copthorne Environment Group & Infrastructure Working Party, a survey has been

developed to identify the possibilities for providing a volunteer transport service within the Parish to also include other villages nearby. This Survey will be published on the Parish Website and links to it published in the Village Magazines (see page 7).

The Petition to ask Mid Sussex District Council to consider creating a separate Parish Council for Crawley Down has created considerable uncertainty as to whether the Working Party should continue in being as such a split in the Parish Council will inevitably limit the funds available to pursue the outstanding initiatives planned. It has also diverted the attention and focus by the members of the Working Party. However, if you wish to be involved in the future well being of the Village, the Working Party is keen to hear from you. Please contact the Parish Office for more information.

Our Local Sussex Police PCSOs

We invited two of our local PCSO's to introduce themselves –

PCSO SOPHIE NORMAN

I am PCSO Sophie Norman and I have been a PCSO with Sussex Police for just short of 2 years and a PCSO with the British Transport Police in central London before that for 2 years.

The areas that Roxie and I cover are Crawley Down, Copthorne and Turners Hill.

I am very keen to set up some beat surgeries in all three areas where the residents will get a chance to meet their local officers if we are not already known, share literature with residents and to give any crime prevention advice that is needed. I am hoping to publish dates as soon as possible when the finer details are sorted. We are hoping to have a base in our three villages so that we are more of a support to the community.

One issue that we are well aware of is speeding and the number of lorries coming through the village. We are working closely with Community Speed Watch to help combat the issue. This group is a massive asset to us, and in the bigger picture of trying to reduce this county wide problem. Recently we have been joining the group and issuing traffic offence reports for excess speed and other minor traffic offences when we find them. We are aware of the problem areas in regard to the excessive amount of Lorries coming through the village and will be working with the Parish Council to support them in their effort to make the village safer.

Another issue we are fully aware of is Anti-Social Behaviour in some areas. Again, we are well aware of the hotspots and will continue to regularly patrol those areas to prevent and deter any anti-social behaviour and minor crime.

Roxie and I are looking forward to building and developing good working relationships with residents, businesses and Council members.

PCSO ROXIE RYE

Hi, my name is PCSO Rye, but feel free to call me Roxie.

I am a mother of 2 young children, who have the unnerving tact of driving me round the bend.

I am a Youth Leader for my Local Youth Group which has been running for nearly 15 years.

I am a Cadet Leader for the Police Cadets, the LGBTQ+ Liaison Officer for Crawley and Mid Sussex and finally I am in training to become the Police Liaison Officer for the Deaf/Hard of Hearing, having just passed my Level 1 Sign Language Course.

I have worked with Sussex Police for 5 years now and thoroughly enjoy my job!

I have been your Local PCSO since October 2020 and have tried to get stuck in as much I am able to. If you haven't seen me yet, not to fear, I am out and about.

Before I joined the Mid Sussex team in October, I worked at Gatwick Airport for Sussex Police, again as a PCSO.

Working out on division is very different to working at the Airport. For one, the laws are slightly different, meaning I had to also learn Bye Laws as well as our usual ones. I was also given extra training to deal with the rarer but more extreme events such as a Plane Crash, Terrorist Event or Bomb Explosion.

Working for the Police definitely has its highs and lows, good days and bad days, but it can be a rewarding job.

MY RETIREMENT AS CHURCH READER

On 13th May 2021, after nearly 26 years, I retired from being a Reader at All Saints'. A Reader is a lay person, licensed & authorised by a bishop, to help the clergy with various tasks including preaching, leading worship, pastoral and educational work.

I had taught in Sunday School, and led Bible studies & prayer meetings, but my first experience of leading public worship was whilst doing National Service in Wiltshire. Three of us were to lead a service at Coate Primitive Methodist Chapel, near Swindon, but the other soldiers dropped out so I led the service & preached on my own. But when God calls, He enables!

Demobbed in 1959, at some stage I joined a team leading Sunday evening services at Heatherly Cheshire Home, Copthorne, eventually leading them on my own. In the early 1960s I moved from Sunday School teaching to leading a Covenanter young men's Bible Group where I was occasionally taking services at Copthorne Chapel and other non-conformist churches.

In 1972 we moved to Crawley Down and, after 2-3 years in an unattached house group, we were led into All Saints' Church. Once more I was teaching in the Sunday School, leading the oldest class that became the Sunday Group and eventually Pathfinders. When vicar Richard Sweet-Escott needed the Sunday School's help with the Christingle Service and the Crib Service, I ended up taking a leading part and preaching. So in 1985 the Churchwardens, Roy Norris & Terry Miles, proposed that I train as a Reader.

I had to provide two referees and a brief CV, was interviewed twice and accepted in 1986 by the Diocesan Panel of Assessors for training as a Reader. The course was then a national one & should have lasted 3 years. A tutor was appointed and, after meeting with him, I wrote my first essay. To ensure my essays were readable, I bought my first computer.

But then disaster struck! I was Senior Partner in an estate agents opposite Three Bridges Station. We read in the press that my office was to be demolished to make way for a dual carriageway with new railway arch, serving the new Maidenbower neighbourhood. So I spent the next few years negotiating the sale of my office, acquiring a new site and designing & building a new office. My tutor agreed to put my training on hold.

Shortly after this we merged with an East Grinstead firm, further delaying training. Meanwhile I had completed a study of the worship in Balcombe Parish and, with my wife Eileen, the Bishop's Certificate of Education. Eventually, after attending the annual Diocesan Readers Conference, I made the effort to restart my training, only to be told by my tutor that he did not think I was still a trainee! The syllabus had changed twice and the diocese could not find me a new tutor. But a friend had trained under Rev John Loxton, vicar of Turners Hill, and he agreed to finish tutoring me.

So after nine years as a trainee I was licensed in Chichester Cathedral on 16th September 1995 by Bishop Ian Cundy of Lewes. Little did I know that my Incumbent, Rev John Strong, would soon become ill prior to resignation!

On the morning of the Harvest Festival he was too ill to attend. I had a premonition that would happen and when Terry Miles rang to acquaint me, he agreed, as church warden, to lead the main service. I delivered a sermon that I had part prepared, and my wife produced the visual aids - teamwork! Within an hour or two of John's resignation, the Rural Dean (my first tutor) told me who would celebrate at services for the next 6 weeks but, he asked me to lead the Remembrance Day services in church and at the Crawley Down War Memorial, a real privilege. In the rain, I learnt to always encapsulate any notes used outside! I think it was in that interregnum that I led many of the Christmas services and assisted the Bishop of Europe at the Midnight Eucharist.

In 1995 I did extra training to lead funerals. I have not led many, nor buried many ashes, but to lead an aunt's funeral and burial at Croydon I had to have permission from the bishops of both Horsham & Southwark. I have enjoyed ministry in other churches, having taken services in Turners Hill, Copthorne & Hammerwood parishes. But as a trainee I was severely rebuked for leading services out of my parish. My annual return showed I led services in 5 other churches. The training priest did not know they were all nonconformist!

I am not the only person to have served as Reader at All Saints'. The first I know of was a GP, Dr Orr Ewing. I just missed the ministry of Alex Park, former Head Master of Crawley Down School, but lunched with him at a Readers' Conference. Ron Henley completed training here and later we valued the ministry of Barry Bull & Margaret Telford, and finally Mark Alderton. All except Mark are now serving in Heaven; Mark is licensed to South Crawley Parish. I hope others will hear God calling them to Reader ministry or to another authorised lay ministry. If God calls you, He will enable. With God all things are possible.

I await seeing what God has planned for me now. His word to me is *"Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?"* [Isaiah 43:1]

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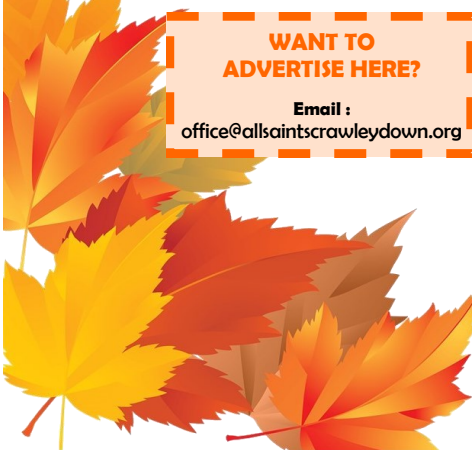
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
