

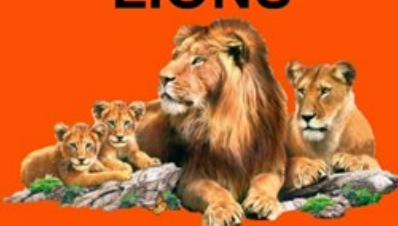

THE POWER OF LOVE IN ACTION

Easter is a season of grace, renewal and hope and this year the Church of England enters Eastertide with a historic sign of new beginnings as Dame Sarah Mullally, former Bishop of London, was installed on 25th March as the 106th Archbishop of Canterbury. As the first woman ever to hold this office, it's a significant moment and highlights the church's ongoing journey towards deeper inclusion, wider representation, and renewed mission.

As part of her acceptance of the role Archbishop Sarah speaks of her Christian vocation, both as a secular nurse and throughout her ordained ministry, being shaped especially by the story of Jesus washing his disciples' feet. We find the account of this act of humble service in John's Gospel, taking place during Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples immediately before his betrayal, arrest, trial and crucifixion. This story as a whole demonstrates the power of love in action.

Archbishop Sarah has shared her desire for the Church to be a place where all can encounter the love of Christ, where disagreements are handled with humility, and where service to the poor and vulnerable remain at the heart of its witness. She steps into leadership during a time of challenge within the church and world stage, yet her appointment offers a moment of renewed hope and invites us to pray for her, for our communities, and for the Church we are becoming together.

May God grant her wisdom, courage, and joy as she steps into this historic calling—and may we, in turn, be ready to follow Christ faithfully in our own lives, allowing His love to inspire us to act justly, love mercy, and walk humbly as we shine Christ's light and hope in our homes, workplaces, families, and neighbourhoods.

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UP, UP AND AWAY IN RECEPTION!

The Reception children at Crawley Down Village C of E school have had a fantastic start to the second half of the spring term. We have launched straight back into our **"UP, UP AND AWAY"** topic, with a continued focus on space, and the excitement has certainly been out of this world.

Our classroom role play area was transformed into a space station, complete with hanging planets and plenty of countdowns for take off. The children have eagerly stepped into the roles of astronauts, mission control operators and even friendly aliens. It has been wonderful to see their imaginations soar as they collaborate on space missions, travel to distant planets and solve problems together mid flight.



Creativity has also been shining brightly. The children have been busy designing and creating their own planets using paper plates, paints and collage materials. From fiery red lava planets to swirling blue and green worlds, each creation has been wonderfully unique. The children have loved talking about their designs and explaining what might live on their imaginary planets.



Our love of stories continues to grow as we explore books linked to space and aliens. These stories have sparked curiosity, thoughtful and plenty of ambitious vocabulary. They have also inspired our work in Drawing Club, where the children have been using their phonic knowledge to sound out and write words and

simple sentences! It is always a pleasure to see the children applying their phonics so confidently and independently.

At the time of writing, although we had only just completed our first week back, the first half of the spring term ahead promises to be busy and exciting. We were very much looking forward to our visit to All Saints' Church, where the children will learn more about the church and its importance within our local community. We are also excited about our trip to East Grinstead Library, which will further nurture the children's growing love of books and storytelling.

It has been a wonderful start to the half term, and we are excited to see where our space adventures will take us next!

February has been a busy month for the Group with three residential (nights away) experiences. The Beaver Scout Sleepover in Weavers Lodge at Blackland Farm attended by 27 Beaver Scouts and 11 Adult Volunteers including some parents. This gave some of the Beavers their first night away experience and was a great achievement for them.

This was followed by the two nights activity for the Cub Scouts which saw 25 Cubs enjoy many games and activities including climbing, sucker archery, watching bedtime movies accompanied by cake and hot chocolate.

To finish the month 11 Scouts and 3 Leaders braved a very wet and muddy Broadstone Warren with 250 other Scouts for "Frost and Flame" weekend camp where they made many

new friends and enjoyed many activities including tomahawk throwing, archery, crate stacking and aeroball. They also found out that some of our ageing tentage was not completely waterproof.

Well done to all the 63 young people and the adult volunteers some of which attended all three activities - where would we be without them?

ALL the MILK BOTTLE TOPS collected in the local area are then collected by GHS Recycling Ltd from a central collector who lives in East Grinstead. GHS pay by weight to recycle them and the money raised is sent directly to **Great Ormond Street Children's Hospital**

The granulated tops are then used to make hard plastic toys for children, such as slides and other garden toys. They are also used to make more bottle tops!

Unable to trace one family link he eventually found that they were now living in South Africa. A member of this family was a distant cousin of Sapper Clay and was residing in Ireland. Thanks to John's perseverance the medal was finally returned to the family who were delighted to receive it, and remembered talk of their relative. John's talk had us intrigued at every turn and we enjoyed hearing about his adventure.

Derrick Hughes was our February speaker. We had met Derrick before when he and his wife entertained us with their collection of unusual instruments. This time Derrick came to talk about his years as a headmaster. Firstly, he talked about his time as a pupil in the 50s. Many of us related to school during this time; he reminded us of green painted corridors and rooms, and the smell of disinfectant!

We enjoyed Derrick's stories about his time as a headmaster. If a child was disruptive, he would ask them to write a letter to him; he read out some of the letters which were very amusing. It sounds as if we would have enjoyed having someone like Derrick as a headmaster.

Eventually, it was so bad that her husband said that their marriage would be over if she didn't stop. Dee said that this was the wake-up call she needed and so she joined Alcoholics Anonymous and also sought counselling. Together they worked and she has now been dry for 26 years. She has recently written a book of short stories entitled "*The Boutique*" and a number of our members bought copies. Dee was a really inspirational speaker, relating how she triumphed over her addiction.

The meeting on 5th March began with the AGM when Anne Horrell was unanimously confirmed as our President for 2026. Jan Albury presented the balance sheet which was accepted by the members. Finally, thanks were extended to the officers and committee for their hard work and commitment in 2025.

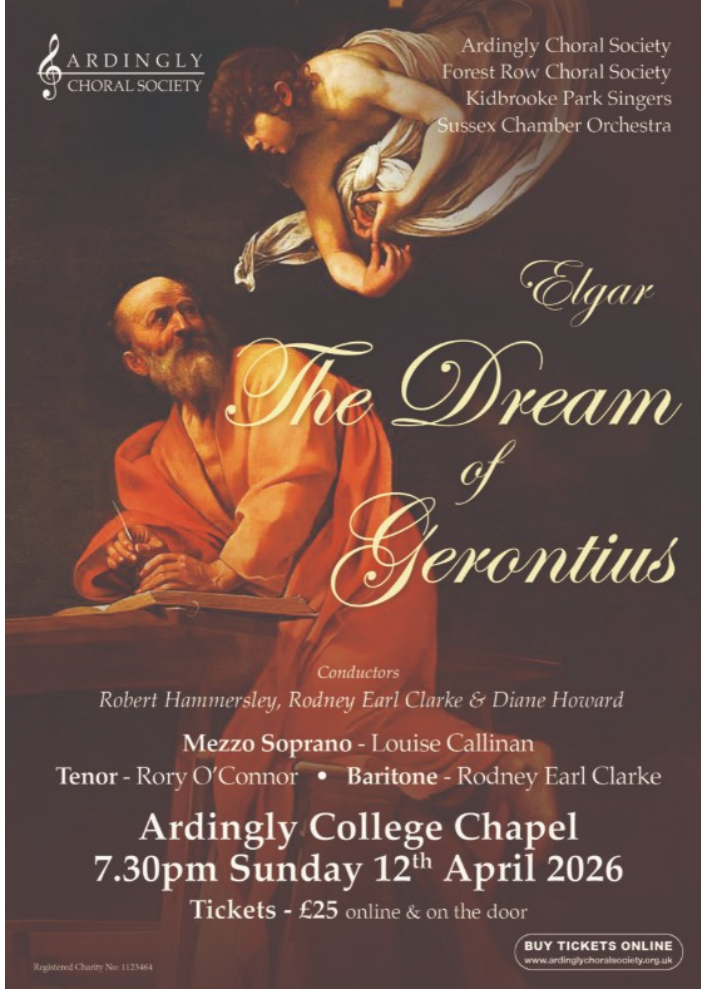

CRAWLEY DOWN GATWICK FC

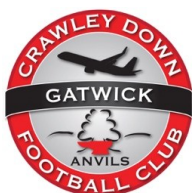

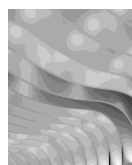

WORTH PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

After a seemingly long, dark winter, it's pleasing to know that springtime is finally with us. There is so much going on in our two villages at the moment, with major projects coming towards fruition, new County Council elections on the horizon and improvements being undertaken throughout the parish.

By the time you read this, our annual Parish Awards will have taken place; at time of writing, I am looking forward to attending this wonderful event, and to thanking those who have helped to make our community so much better.

PARISH AWARDS

We had a wonderful response to the Parish Award nominations, with over 30 nominations made from the community. We hope everyone had a great time at the awards and we are already looking forward to next year's event.

A special thanks to our sponsors – KT Kat Kreations, Branding Box, Olive Branch Hypnotherapy, Duman Turkish Restaurant, Paw Paddock, Awakening the Moon and Dough and Cakes.

Without these generous donations, we would not have been able to host such a brilliant evening. The biggest thanks need to go to the volunteers - our community wouldn't be what it is without all of the amazing volunteers selflessly contributing their time and efforts over many years.

WORTH PARISH COUNCIL BUDGET

Leaflets detailing Worth Parish Council's budget for 2026-27 have been distributed throughout the parish recently, and relevant information is also available on our website and social media platforms. We also published a budget breakdown for further information on where your money is spent. In Crawley Down and Copthorne, the average household will pay £97.15 for our running costs, a little over £8 per month.

Services we provide include youth clubs, allotments, playgrounds, street lights, village greens, waste collection from public areas, community grants, grounds maintenance, support to local events and much more!

OPERATION WATERSHED

We are delighted to announce we have received funding of £75,000 to improve drainage on King George V Field (*the field on Sandy Lane with the tennis club*).

This was made possible with continued efforts and persistence from local residents. We hope this work will resolve the longstanding drainage problem and provide some relief to residents.

BOWERS PLACE PARKING

This project has taken many years to come to fruition, and at the time of writing this newsletter, we are waiting for some final agreements to be approved before we can instruct contractors.

It is exciting that after so much work, the parking spaces (at the time of writing) appear soon to be built.

FACEBOOK

Did you know that Worth Parish Council has a very active Facebook page? It offers information about a wide range of subjects, including roadworks, events, Council meetings, police matters, litter picks, allotments and much, much more. CRAWLEY DOWN PLAY AREA

Planning will begin later this year to improve the play area. This may not be evident, as work will be taking place behind the scenes initially. We hope to make major improvements to the area, beginning with replacing the fencing and eventually extending the play area and upgrading the surfacing and some equipment.

We are aware that there have been ongoing issues with the roundabout and we are working with the supplier on a long-term solution.

SAFER STREETS

An important message from Sussex Alerts: Help us to tackle anti social behaviour.

We are actively patrolling hotspot areas, but we need your eyes and ears. If you witness anti-social behaviour you can report it here: <https://www.sussex.police.uk/ro/report/asb/asb-v3/report-antisocial-behaviour/>

Reports help us to target areas and discourage behaviour that makes communities feel unsafe.

By reporting issues as and when they occur, you'll be helping the Police to build a greater understanding of potential hot spots, and this can then assist with allocating resources in the future.

Remember : posting details of an incident on Facebook or other social media platform is not the same as reporting via the correct channels.

SPEEDING IN CRAWLEY DOWN

Speedwatch are still in desperate need of volunteers and are appealing for more to come forward. Being a volunteer can involve as little as one hour every two or three weeks, although if you'd like to do more that would of course be welcomed. For more information, please go to communityspeedwatch.co.uk and click on Register/Join an Existing Group. Alternatively, you can email Steve O'Connell of Sussex Police at stephen.oconnell@sussex.police.uk

They now have 2,500 volunteers across Sussex, with 190 Parish Councils and 15 Wardens carrying out Community Speedwatch initiatives. They issue 5,000 letters per month to drivers for speeding; from this they only have a repeat offender rate of less than 5% out of the 60,000 or so letters sent over the year, which means drivers really do take notice.

If you witness speeding in and around the village, you can report it via Operation Crackdown at operationcrackdown.org

CLARION HOUSING

The Crawley Down Working Party recently met with representatives from Clarion Housing to discuss ongoing concerns about several of their properties in the village. Clarion shared the progress they've made over the past year and expressed confidence that their engagement with residents has improved, with many issues now moving toward positive resolution.

If you are a Clarion resident, please continue to report any problems directly to them as soon as they occur. We will continue our engagement with Clarion as matters progress.

PLANNING

Despite robust objections from Worth Parish Council and a number of local residents, Mid Sussex District Council **recently approved a scheme to construct 48 new homes at Woodland Close in Crawley Down.**

We'd like to thank all the members of the public who wrote letters and who came to our meetings to make their feelings known. WPC's Planning Committee meet every month, and these meetings are open to the public. If you feel strongly about planning matters, or are just curious about the processes involved, why not come along to the next one? Details of upcoming meetings can be found on our website.

With regard to planning enforcement, we are aware of some significant breaches in planning regulations elsewhere in the parish in recent times. As always, we continue to report these to MSDC and we would like to thank them for taking the appropriate action as and when necessary.

If you suspect a breach, be sure to contact MSDC at the earliest opportunity.

YOUTH CLUBS IN CRAWLEY DOWN & COPTHORNE

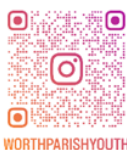
