SEPTEMBER HOPE

"I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing." John 15:5

A **mascots programme** - whereby boys and girls from the junior teams walk out with the players on matchdays - has helped first team attendances more than double at Crawley Down Gatwick Football Club during the last 12 months.

The initiative came from chairman Dave Connor with the intention of not only bringing the adult and junior sections of the club closer together but also helping the club become more involved in the community. While parents and other relations have come along to see their children be matchday mascots, many have enjoyed the occasion so much that they are returning to watch further games.

Under-16s are allowed in free to all matches when accompanied by an adult.

A number of other community initiatives which were introduced last season are set to continue, including delivering leaflets and collecting Christmas trees for St Catherine's Hospice.

THE RVS : GOOD NEIGHBOURS SERVICE

The Good Neighbours service from the Royal Voluntary Service provides 12 weeks' of support to socially isolated older people living in West Sussex. The visits aim to help older people re-engage with their local community, become more independent and feel less socially isolated. This could include companionship on a short walk or helping someone to access a club or group.

Service entry criteria

- People 65 years and over, living alone
- People who feel socially isolated or lonely
- People who do not have a network of local support
- People who are unable to access activities without support

The service is volunteer delivered and can only offer low-level support for a limited time. It's not suitable for individuals with complex health needs. Each referral is reviewed case-by-case, and anyone can refer themselves or someone they know, with the person's permission.

The service is available in : Adur, Arun, Chichester, Crawley, Horsham and Mid Sussex.

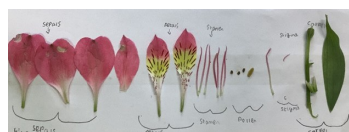

OUR SEWING PROJECT

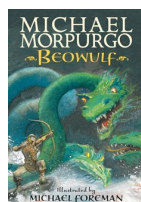

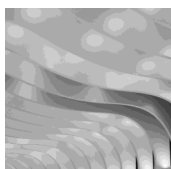

MID SUSSEX PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP

In our previous Newsletter we were hoping to be able to comment on the report from the CQC following their return inspection of Modality Mid Sussex earlier this year. Sadly, this is still not possible due to a lack of that report.

What we can say is that our daily monitoring of the quality of most services provided by Modality continues to show a gradual improvement. There is also a more positive and confident air to the everyday working in the four health practices. Despite this, we recognise that challenges still remain

The Patient Participation Group (PPG) are now in a better position to look to the future and we have identified our next task. The introduction of Rapid Health, whilst making booking an appointment easier for the majority of patients, has presented a new challenge to others - those that cannot utilise smartphones, tablets, laptops etc.

Our PPG are just setting out on a long-term project to aid these patients. We have called it **"Digital Inclusion"**. Our first challenge is to identify who needs help. Then we need to find a means of communicating with them in a manner that suits them. Ideally small meetings where we try to explain how the new digital system works. Depending upon how each individual responds will determine if we can help them, and how. We recognise what a challenge this will be.

We are pleased to report that Modality Mid Sussex have agreed to assist us in any way they can.

About us : The Modality Mid Sussex Patient Participation Group is an independent organisation run wholly by volunteers with the aim of constructively facilitating good relations between Modality Mid Sussex GP practice and the community it serves. WORTH PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

It's been a wonderful summer in the parish, with a number of highly successful events taking place. And as a very welcome bonus, the weather was pretty kind on the whole. Now we look forward to a new season for all of us in Crawley Down and Cophorne.

We'd like to say congratulations to everyone involved with the **GIG ON THE GREEN** in July (where the rain did sadly make an appearance) and the **CRAWLEY DOWN VILLAGE FAYRE** in September. Both of these occasions, along with several other smaller events in the parish, were highly enjoyable and extremely well supported.

On a more sombre note, **ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR** can be extremely upsetting for all of us, so it's important to know how to report it. **SUSSEX POLICE OPERATES A USER-FRIENDLY WEB PAGE THAT MAKES REPORTING AS EASY AS CAN BE** (see below), and we encourage all our local residents to use it as and when necessary. By building up an accurate picture of potential hotspots, the authorities can then respond in an appropriate manner.

THE ROYAL OAK PUB

Members of the Crawley Down Working Party have met with the owner of the Royal Oak three times in this past year to discuss the building and find out what plans there are to improve it. The building is in a poor state of repair and in a prominent position on Station Road, so local councillors are keen to ensure the building is made safe and brought back into use.

THE OWNER INTENDS TO BRING FORWARD A PLANNING APPLICATION FOR THE SITE which is likely to include flats on the first floor with a community space on the ground floor, and a retail unit at the rear of the site. The owner was encouraged to do early community engagement on any plans so that local residents can have their say.

THE FULL NOTES OF THIS MEETING WERE PUBLISHED with the agenda for the Planning & Highways Committee meeting on 1st September.

By reporting issues as and when they occur, you'll be helping the police to build a greater understanding of potential hot spots, and this can then assist with allocating resources in the future.

COUNCIL DROP-IN SESSIONS

LOCAL GOVERNMENT REVIEW

The Local Government Review which will see Mid Sussex District Council and West Sussex County Council merged into one new unitary authority is currently underway. As part of this process, Worth Parish Council is actively engaging with the review to understand what any proposed changes could mean for the community. The Council is currently gathering information, considering the potential impacts and working to ensure the voices of local residents are represented. Once clearer details are available, Worth Parish Council will share updates with the community to keep everyone informed and involved in the process.

PLANNING

The Planning & Highways Committee has had a few large planning applications to consider for Crawley Down recently. We would always recommend that if you feel strongly about a planning application, that you ensure that you submit your views to Mid Sussex District Council, attend our meetings and contact your local councillors to make your views known. Whilst Worth Parish Council is not the authority responsible for making decisions on planning, we are able to represent the views and concerns of the community to Mid Sussex District Council, who are the local Planning Authority.

LAND NORTH OF BURLEIGH LANE IS OF SIGNIFICANT LOCAL INTEREST, so residents may be interested to know that the Committee has met with the developer and the officer at MSDC to highlight the concerns of the community. As always, the earlier we are informed of concerns and issues, the more chance we have of exerting influence.

SPEEDING IN THE VILLAGE

Speedwatch are still in desperate need of volunteers and are appealing for more to come forward. Being a volunteer can involve as little as one hour every two or three weeks, although if you'd like to do more that would of course be welcomed. They now have 2,500 volunteers across Sussex, with 190 Parish Councils and 15 Wardens carrying out Community Speedwatch initiatives. They issue 5,000 letters per month to drivers for speeding; from this they only have a repeat offender rate of less than 5% out of the 60,000 or so letters sent over the year, which means drivers really do take notice.

BOWERS PLACE CAR PARKING

As part of our plans to improve the village, we are intending to create 18 new parking spaces on Bowers Place, east of the Village Green. This is a project that has been ongoing for several years, so you have most likely seen details before. Following ongoing discussions with West Sussex County Council about the technical details of our proposal, we have made some necessary changes and are now reapplying for planning permission.

These spaces will be available for all public parking and will not be subject to parking restrictions. **THE PARKING SPACES WILL BE CREATED BY CONVERTING THE EXISTING VERGE AND PATH INTO PARKING SPACES**, enabling vehicles to park off the highway and providing a clear carriageway through to the Health Centre. We will update the community once the planning application is live, so that you can have your say on the plans.

DEFIBRILLATOR

The defibrillator at Crawley Down shops fell into disrepair several months ago and we have been trying to find a compatible battery to fix it, but that has not been possible. We now know that the machine cannot be fixed so we have applied for funding for a new machine; we should hear back about the funding in the next month or two. If funding is refused, the Council has already agreed that a new machine can be purchased and this will be done.

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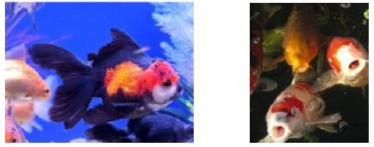
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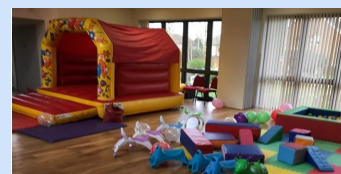
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
